A Holistic Interpretation of Holiness

Purification:

- Act 15:8 And God, who knows the human heart, testified to them by giving them the Holy Spirit, just as he did to us;
- Act 15:9 and in cleansing their hearts by faith he has made no distinction between them and us.

Empowerment:

• Act 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

PURIFICATION & SERVICE

Purification is to supply my own needs.....

Empowerment is to supply for the needs of others

- John Wesley interpreted sanctification as the process where love expels sin
- Stanley Jones added:
 "Sanctification as a process where love expels sin and is conductive to love others"
 - Purification without Service leads toward Indifference
 - New disciples should be trained into the Kingdom values
 - If you have not experienced Purification, then there was never Justification by Faith,




THE PROBLEM OF A FRAGMENTED SPIRITUALITY

Any one or two of these perspectives emphasized by itself leads to a distortion of the Gospel of Christ.


- Believers today pick & choose where to attend

OBSTACLE #1: INDIVIDUALISM

- •The legacy of 300 years of Modernism.
- •The **reduction** of God's good news to individual salvation.


- Debt is the main feature of consumerism
- Disciples aren't consumers, they should be producers.
- the problem of consumerism is the marketing of sacred things as if they were commodities to be consumed



OBSTACLE #2: CONSUMERISM

It keeps us from being able to participate in God's mission to the world.

- Megachurches function like corporations instead of following the organic DNA of the Primitive church
- Churches that are most effective in delivering a product tend to be the least effective in making disciples




OBSTACLE #3: MATERIALISM

Materialism is a barrier between missions and community

Believers listen to the word,
 Disciples obey the word.

A New/Old way of making Disciples

- Jesus spent at most three years discipling the apostles.
- Jesus focused in a process:
 - 1. Time of Discovery
 - 2. An inclusive Family
 - 3. Kingdom Now/Eternity Now
 - 4. Apprentice learning curve
 - 5. Spiritual Transformation

THE ISSUE OF RELATIONSHIPS

- Modernist tend to be autonomous, which manifests in individualist lifestyles: "personal relationship with God"
 & the tendency to fellowship with the immediate family.
- Easterners understand that relationships are inclusive & entails faith, family & tradition.
- Postmodernist are pluralistic, they prefer disconnected relationships without much compromise

- We Modernist are notorious for valuing security
 - (insurance, job security, retirement plans)
- The Easterners value legacy,
 - They value legacy as the most important thing to pass on to the next generation.
 - (Faith, Family)
- Postmodernists value the "here & now"
 - They value "gratification" at the core center of its values.
 - Little emphasis on tomorrow

The Primitive church offered its members a "window to heaven" the possibility of healing, God's intervention, Hope and eschatological direction.
