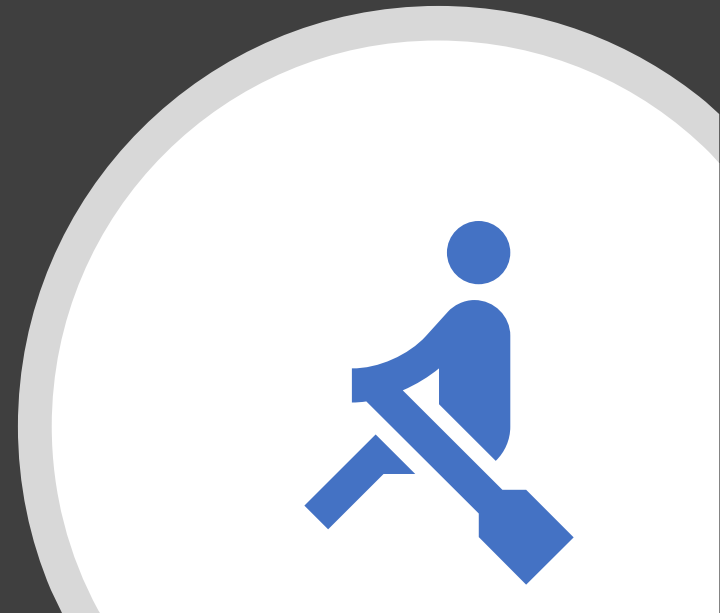
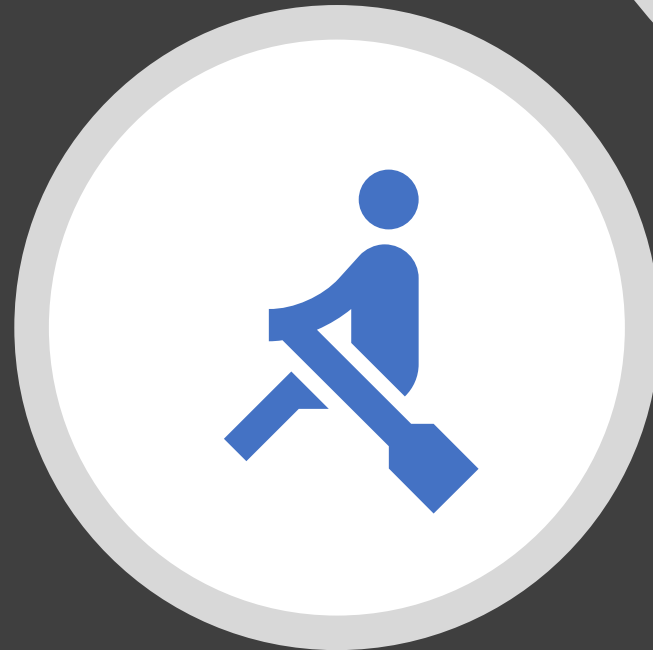

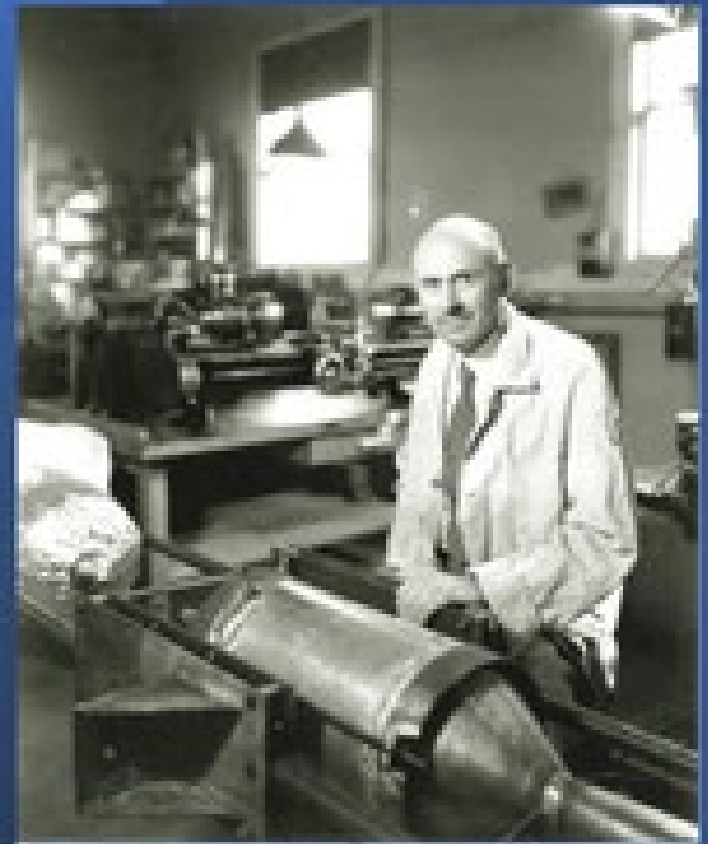


ROBERT HUTCHINGS GODDARD

1882 — 1945

TEACHER, PHYSICIST, INVENTOR AND PIONEERING GENIUS, WHOSE WORK USHERED IN A NEW AGE FOR MANKIND — THE AGE OF SPACE FLIGHT. IN THIS BUILDING, AS A MEMBER OF THE CLARK UNIVERSITY FACULTY, DR. GODDARD BEGAN HIS EXPERIMENTAL WORK IN JET PROPULSION AND CONSTRUCTED THE FIRST SUCCESSFUL LIQUID PROPELLANT ROCKET, FIRED IN AUBURN, MASSACHUSETTS, ON MARCH 16, 1926. FIRST TO PROVE THAT A ROCKET CAN OPERATE IN SPACE, FIRST TO DEVELOP GYROSCOPIC STABILIZATION APPARATUS FOR ROCKETS, AND FIRST TO FIRE A ROCKET FASTER THAN THE SPEED OF SOUND, ROBERT GODDARD, THROUGH HIS QUIET DETERMINATION AND UNFAILING COURAGE, GAVE TO THE WORLD THE FOUNDATION FOR THE CONQUEST OF SPACE.

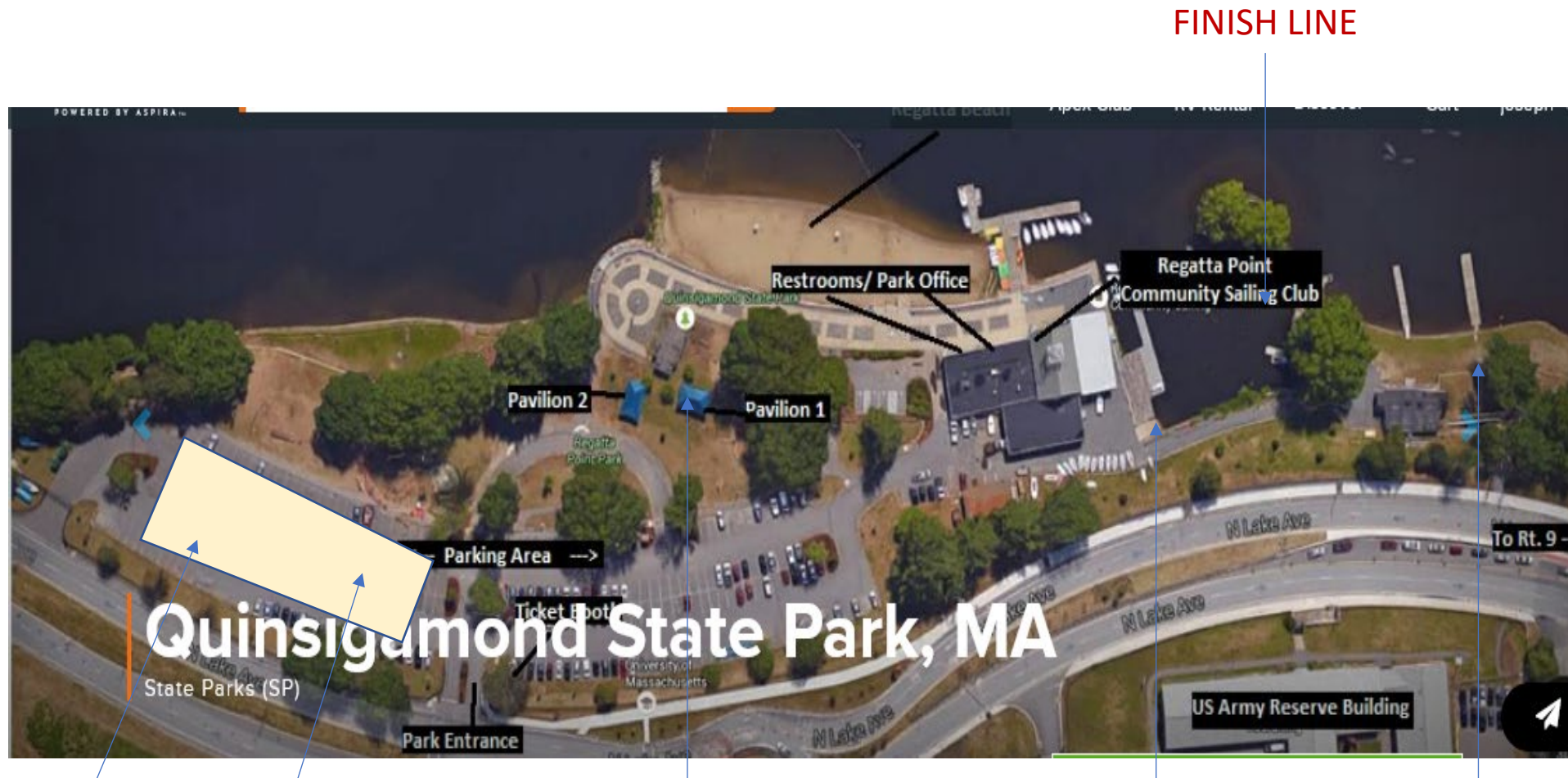

SAFETY

- Our first priority is your Safety, both on and off the water;
- This regatta will be monitored by experienced rescue divers who are also trained EMT's;
- Emergency medical kits will be available with the EMT's;
- For on-water issues, immediately signal nearest official, who will radio for assistance;
- In the event of sudden weather event, official will indicate by siren for evacuation off water back to the docks at Regatta Point;
- Regatta location is less than 5 minutes from the UMass Hospital Emergency Care facility.

REGATTA PARKING

GPS: 10 N. LAKE AVE., WORCESTER, MA

- Regatta Point State Park is open to the general public as a recreational area, and our permit for racing is for Sunday AM until 12 Noon.
- All trailers, cartoppers & participants must park in North half of parking lot. Trailers may be dropped off on Saturday with prior arrangement with Race Director.
- Cartoppers may also drop off on Saturday, but there is limited area for boat storage overnight. The park gates will be locked Saturday evening at 7:30 PM.
- All participants are requested to carpool wherever possible as this event is filled to the maximum number allowed, and parking spaces will be at a premium.
- We will assist all boat trailers and cartoppers in securing space in the lot on Sunday morning. Please arrive no later than 06:45.
- Volunteers will guide/assist you through the lot, to and from the launch dock area.
- Spectators may pay to park in the South half of lot (open to the general public) for typical daily fee. There is overflow parking on N Lake Ave, just past the park. Or in the UMass public garages, up the hill from the park.



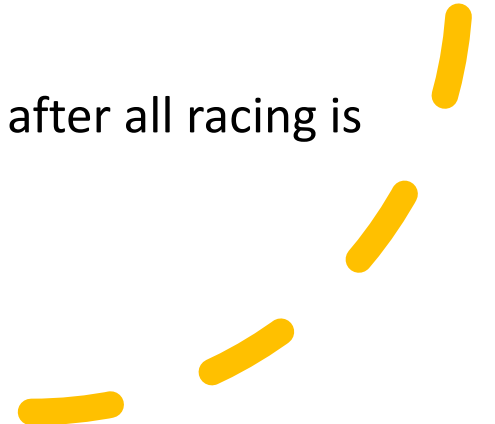
Launching & Take Out

- Do **NOT** get in line to launch *more than 30 minutes before your scheduled start*. It will take 10-15 minutes to get to Marshalling area
- No boat can launch without assigned Bow number.
- **Bow numbers will be distributed at Launch Dock**
- Recovery dock will be immediately south of the Finish Line. Volunteers will assist.
- **Hot Seating** may occur and will be at the South Recovery (wooden) dock. If you are hot-seating, please make this known ahead of time to officials and dock personnel and have sufficient help from your team to make this transition a smooth one!
- No races will be delayed if a hot-seated boat is tardy.



Some
important
things to
bear in
mind!

- **Please make use of volunteers to assist with travel to and from docks. Please make use of teammates and volunteers to assist with oars and shoes**
- **Launching vibe:** Try to keep traffic moving – be conscious of getting on the water efficiently.
- **Coaches** please try to give last minute instructions *prior* to hands-on.
- We will have extra slings at Recovery dock, as we need your help in getting boats off the water.
- **Awards** will be presented at the Pavilion Tent after all racing is completed.





More
important
things to
bear in
mind!

- **Launching** will be at the docks at the South side of the Regatta Point boathouse. Volunteers will assist you from the parking lot to and from the docks.
- ***Bow numbers will be issued in the launch area, and will be collected as you return.***
- The park is simultaneously in use by the **general public** as a swimming and recreation area. Please be mindful of all vehicles and pedestrians as you pass through.





Launch Timing

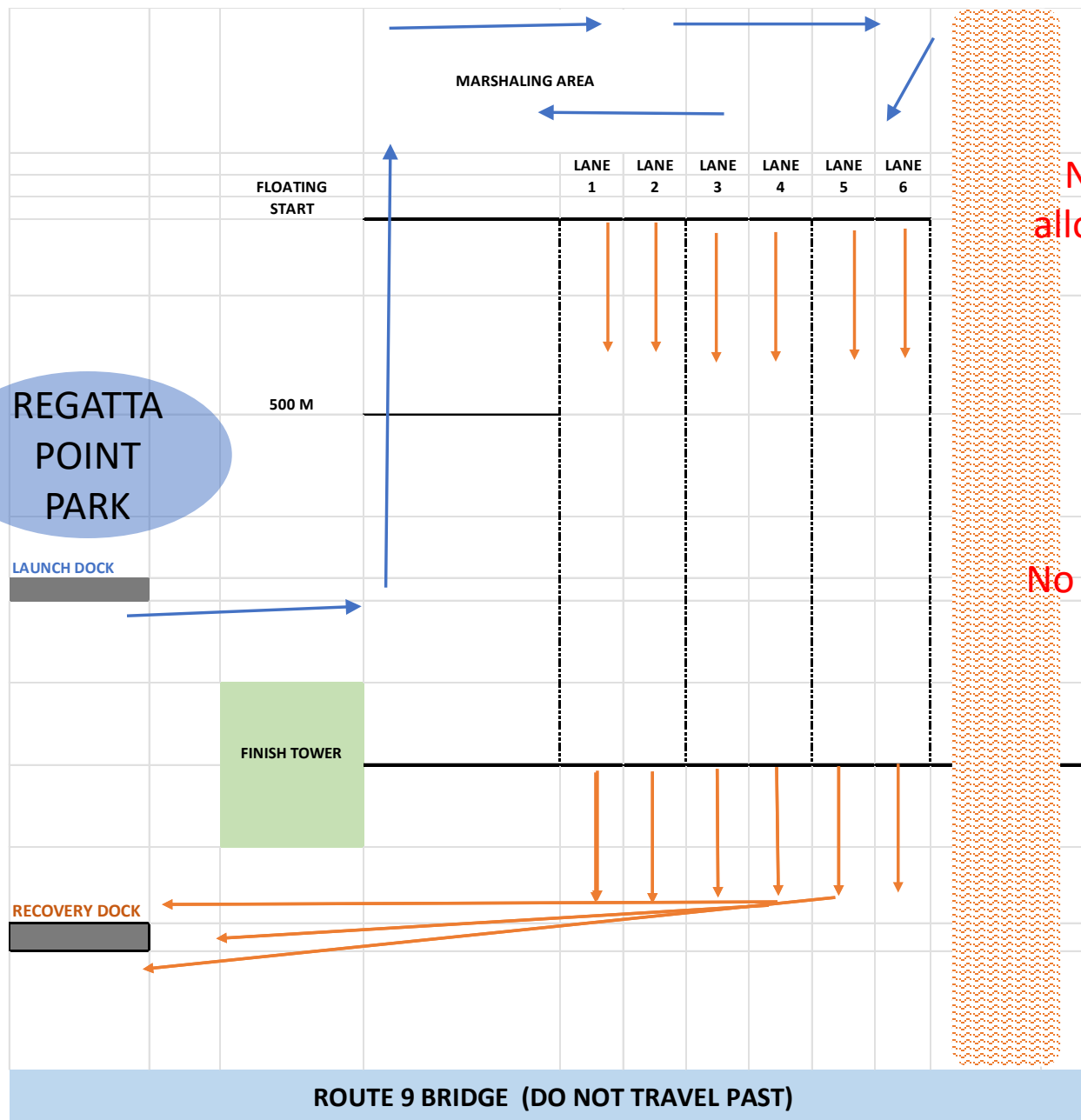
- It takes **10- 15 minutes** to row up to the Marshalling area. Please plan accordingly
- **Launch & row North, on the Worcester side, past the swim beach. Do not get close to swim buoys.**
- Race starts are on 7 or 8 minute centers. No races will be delayed if anyone is late to the Start area.
- **QUICK** start will be utilized. No announcing of crews, just simple alignment, and “Attention, Go!”
- Lanes are double-wide, with two boats between each line of buoys. You will have a buoy line on either your Port side or Starboard side. Do **NOT** cross buoy line.
- **Official timing results will be provided by Here Now.** Manual times from on-water officials will be used as backup.

The Warm-up area

- The warm-up area is no more than 500 meters North of the start line. Stay south of the Donahue Rowing Center. Don't go so far that you miss hearing the call for your race! Stay within earshot. Your Bow numbers will be **color-coded**, so try to stay close with your group.
- There will be marker buoys and marshals in the warm-up area. Traffic pattern is **Clockwise** in the warm-up area.
- **DO NOT GO PAST THE DONAHUE ROWING CENTER**, you risk missing your race start!
- You should be in the **marshaling area** at least **10 minutes** before your event time. This is **YOUR** responsibility. Not the Referee's, not the Marshal's.
- Try to stay close to other crews with your event number and color-code when the time comes – You will be called into your starting lanes in Bow number order (1, 2, 3, 4, 5,6.) **Approach the Start line as a group when called.**

- While you may be an Adult – Remember, there are kids all around too.
- We expect **YOU** to **act as role models**.
- NO **BEER OR ALCOHOL** on site. This is a MA DCR rule in this Park - If we find it in your team area it is cause for *exclusion*.
- “**F-bombs**” and other foul language are not acceptable, and also cause for *exclusion*.
- Think twice before crossing the finishing line and yelling something out you will regret.



Penalties Review

(2-602)
Rules of Rowing
pg. 33

- **Reprimand:** (Informal caution)
- **Warning:** (e. g. Late to start)
(2 warnings in the same race = **Exclusion.**)
- **Exclusion: Voiding into lake will result in immediate exclusion.** (Individual is removed from that event only, that crew can still compete in subsequent events.)
- **Disqualification:** Flagrant disregard for safety/fairness, or Unsportsmanlike behavior (F Bombs/Beer) = Removed from all subsequent events as well.)





Raising an Objection



Filing an Appeal

- If you have an **issue with your race** – you must wait until after the last boat crosses the finish – your protest **MUST** be presented to the Referee at the end of the race, **BEFORE** leaving the Finish area. It will be noted by the Referee to the CHIEF JUDGE and a Red flag shown, indicating the race is NOT final.
- The appeal/protest must be entered in writing (with \$50 cash) **the Race Director after getting off water**. If they cannot resolve your issue on the spot, or you disagree with their ruling, you may ask for an appeal and a Jury will be assembled to discuss it further, after all racing has been completed and **BEFORE** the award for that race is handed.
- **TIP:** Explain not only what is **wrong**, but **what you would like** the Referee to do about it.





Medical Safety

- Please **sit upright at the finish.**
- If you sit slumped in the boat, the Finish Marshall will assume the Athlete is having a medical emergency.
- We will have EMT's at docks ready to deploy, and any Referee can help you get medical attention.
- Stay **Hydrated** and stay **cool!**
- If you have **special medication**, like an inhaler, **MAKE SURE** you take it with you in the boat!

Dr. Robert Goddard Rocket Relay

4 legs – 500 m each; 1x, 2x, plus any two boats of your club's choice;

Match racing – Quarterfinals: Four races;

winners advance to Two Semifinals;

Winners advance to Final.

The Father of Modern Rocketry

October 5, 1882 – August 10, 1945

Rocket Relay



Dr. Goddard's life and life work are inseparable from the City of Worcester. We are hugely proud of the legacy he has left us.

An alum of Worcester Polytechnic Institute and professor at Clark University, his research and experimentation laid the foundation for rocketry and space flight, ushering in the Space Age. This is the 100th anniversary year of his first liquid-fueled rocket flight!

He is renowned for the very traits every rower esteems: *Persistence...Patience...Resilience* in the face of any failure.

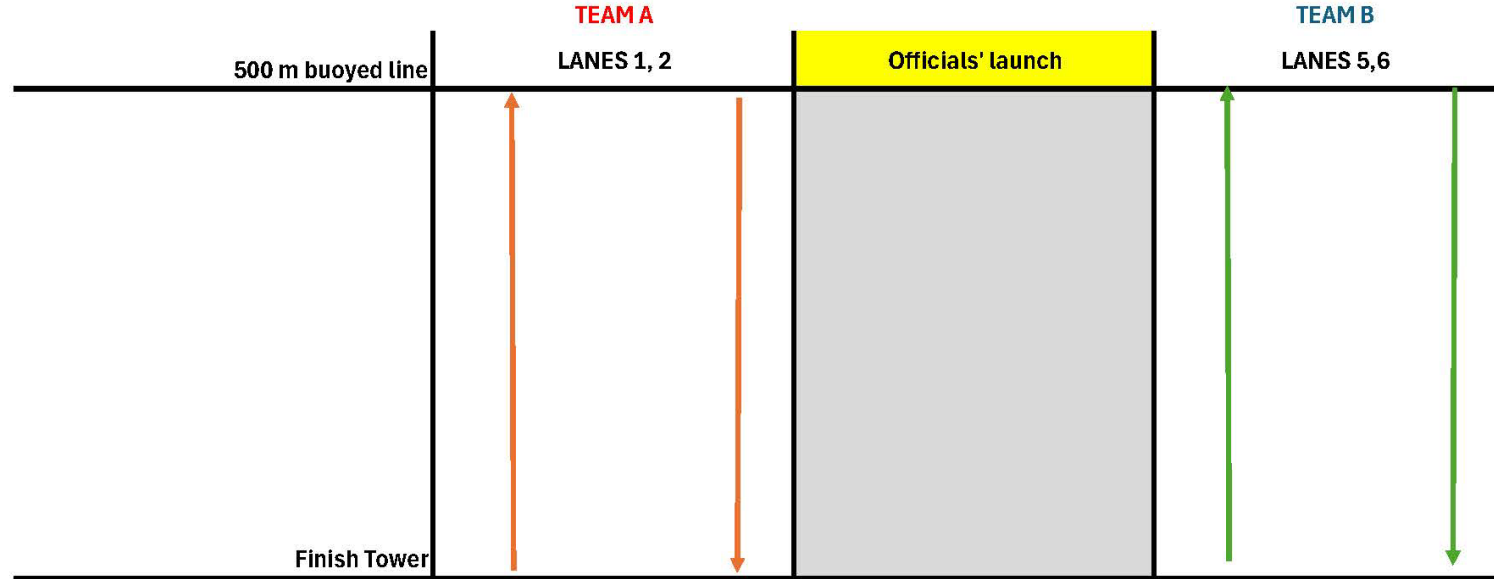
This relay race is named in Dr. Goddard's honor, and we hope to provide a very dynamic performance worthy of his name.



ROCKET RELAY GUIDANCE

- Each team to designate a contact person responsible for lineups and boats.
- Initial matchups will be announced on Race Day
- Contact person will verify its crew's presence with dock control at launch docks
- Be prepared to launch as soon as final 1,000 m sprint races are completed.
- There are strict time constraints to get these races completed.

Third boat - open classification

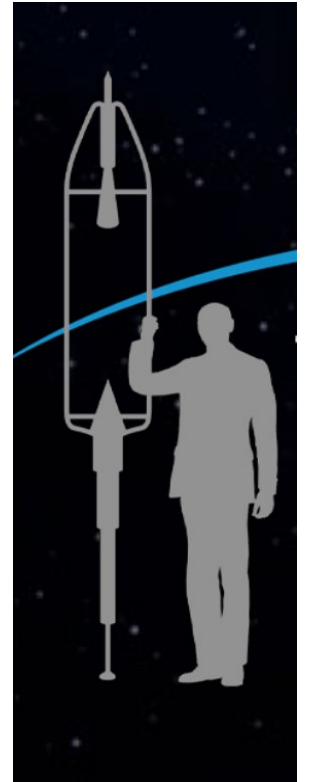
Third boat heads North after second boat passes

Overview**

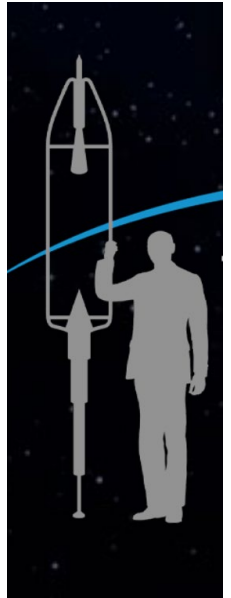
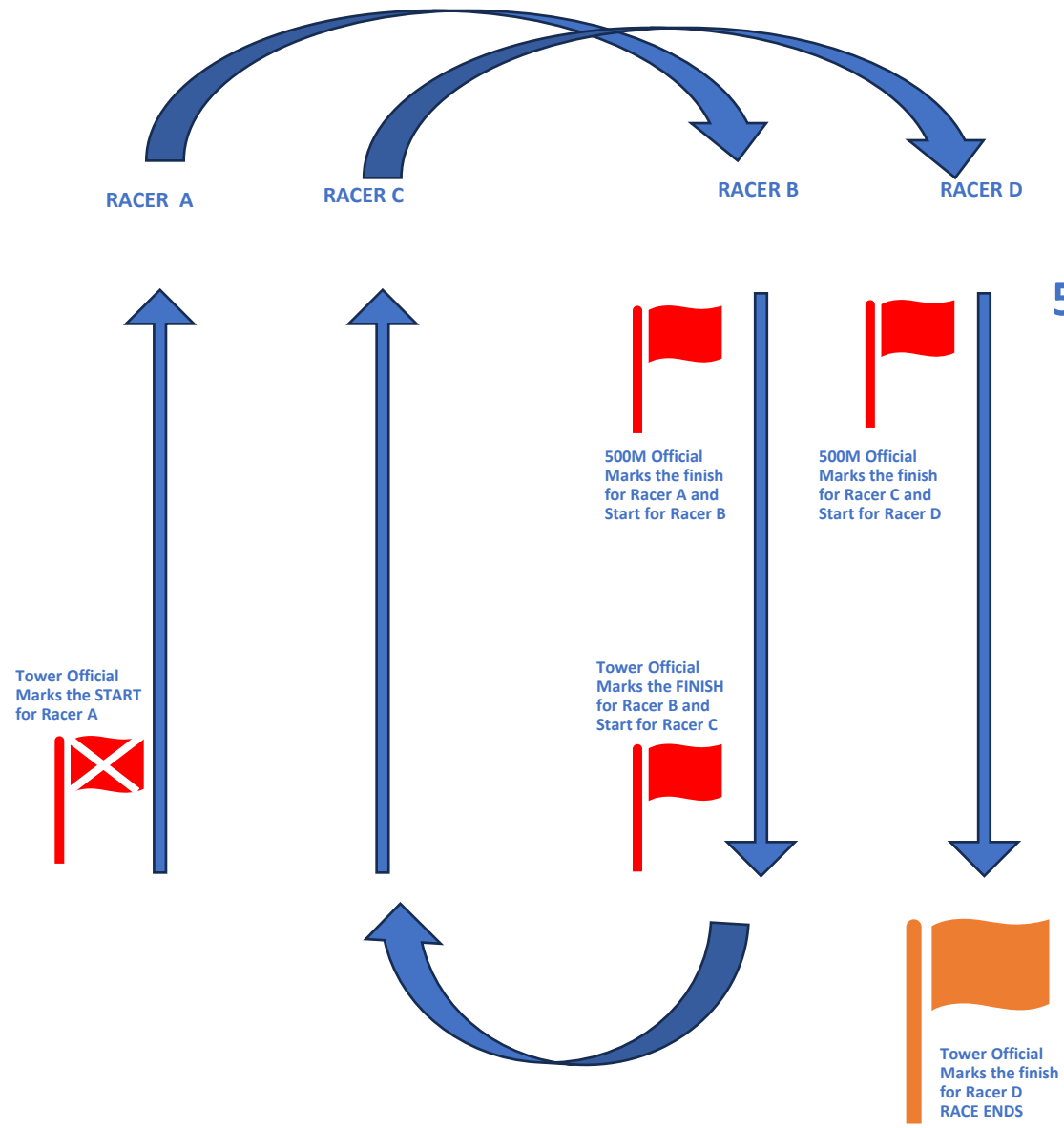

Tower (Start/Finish)



Rocket Relay Rules:

Each race is between two teams. Lanes 1,2 & Lanes 5,6

Each team must consist of at least 1 -1x, and 1 – 2x, then two other boats of any size.

Teams must make every reasonable effort to maintain its bow at marked lines, and not creep ahead. Officials will monitor from stationary launch at 500 M mark of the course. ***Ten-second penalty for early start*** – as judged by line official. There is no appeal on penalty.

Keep buoyed line close on Port side.

First leg (A) heads North from Tower to 500 M mark.

Second leg (B) will head South to Tower after receiving *flag or called start* from attending official. Third (C) and fourth (D) legs repeat as above.

Only the two fastest teams qualify for Final. Times will be as recorded by Race Officials and will include any imposed penalties. Each race will start at Tower and (A) head North to 500 m line, (B)south to line, then repeat with boats (C) & (D).
