




Power to the City


The Experience

The reimagined center provides an immersive exterior and interior experience connecting visitors to the essential role of public works in their every day lives.

Harbor's Edge

The Public Works Experience is geographically located along Baltimore's famed-destination spot—the Inner Harbor Promenade. The entrance is strategically sited along the pedestrian walkway and opens up to create a broader plaza / gathering space for visitors to assemble and mingle. Exterior components will attract viewers and generate excitement to explore the Center with the refurbished Cityscape and iconic Beacon Sculpture wrapping the chimney. Along the pedestrian walkway, activity markers attract attention to the Center and its history.





Streetscape

The existing Streetscape interpretive area will be renovated as a welcoming and immersive experience for viewers of all ages to physically explore public works through hands-on exhibits and interpretation. New attractions within the Streetscape will offer challenges and surprises to long-time museum visitors.









Exhibit Story Flow: Floor 1







Exhibit Story Flow: Floor 2









Exhibit Story Flow: Floor 3







Draft Exhibit Plan: Floor 1



Draft Exhibit Plan: Floor 2







Coal Bin Theater





The Coal Bin Theater will be a featured exhibit attraction on the top floor of the Center. Highlighting the historic building infrastructure of the bins formerly storing coal, bin surfaces will offer intriguing geometry for projections of a variety of media, video, still photography, light effects etc. Viewers traverse over the bins on bridge walkways or around the perimeter, allowing views down and into the planar surfaces.

Building Section



The Public Works Experience is housed in what was once the coal-fed boiler room of the Eastern Avenue Pumping Station. The boilers produced steam for pumps as part of Baltimore's sanitary system.

While the steam has been replaced by electricity, the pumping station is still functioning today In the northern half of the building.

In the Public Works Experience, new levels built on a mezzanine structure and the top of the existing coal bins 36 feet over the existing floor will triple the size of the current exhibit area.

In the Public Works Experience LEED® principles will guide the design, and sustainable features will be implemented to provide a high energy efficient facility.
