

CONCHIDIUM DICKASONII



Origin: Asia

Temperatures: Cool to warm growing mini miniature size orchid species

Light: Bright light

Watering & Fertilizing: Regular watering and fertilizing when in active growing season, goes completely dormant for the winter - no fertilizing from October, no watering from December till new growths appear (light mist to keep pseudobulbs from shriveling).

General care: New in cultivation, we do grow it the same way as our other Conchidium (extinctorium). Bulbs on this Conchidium are slightly larger, seems to be much more shriveled then extinctorium ones and are mono-colored. Blooms should be larger than the extinctorium ones. Not much info is available, but they seem to grow very well in intermediate to warm conditions, with high light levels in the winter when they are completely dormant but shadier in the summer. They will bloom in winter / spring, and new growths will appear late spring and summer. When dormant, keep dry but provide light mist to prevent pseudobulbs from shriveling too much. Great plant for windowsills, greenhouses and outside growing year-round in proper zones.
