School Hours

Kindergarten

Our Kindergarten school day is from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. It is the parent's responsibility to escort their child to the classroom or place their child in the hands of a Safety Patrol student. Parents must leave the classroom promptly at 8:00 a.m. Early Release is on the last Friday of each month at 1:15 p.m. Please plan accordingly.

Grades 1st thru 12th

The school day is from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Early Release is on the last Friday of each month at 1:15 p.m. Please plan accordingly.

Before and After School Care

B.S.C. / A.S.C. (Before School Care/ After School Care)

Before-School Care is available beginning at 7:00 a.m. After-School Care is available from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. for a separate charge. There will be an additional charge of \$1.00 per minute for any child remaining after 6:00 p.m.





Days Closed

Elementary, Middle, and High School

Our school is closed on legal holidays, Teachers' Planning Days, Christmas Recess and Spring Recess.

Admission Requirements

We do not discriminate on the basis of race, color, sex or national origin. Privileges, programs, general activities and policies are made available to all students at Hope Academy. Admission is open to all provided the school has space available. All students applying for K-12th grade must take a placement exam. We admit on a first-come, first-serve basis.



Registration Requirements' Elementary, Middle, and High School

Kindergarten students must be (5) five years old on or before September 1st of the school year.

Kindergarten through (12) twelfth grades are limited to (20) twenty students per class.

- ³ School Registration Form
- ³ Parent's Photo I.D. and Social Security Card
- ³ Student's Birth Certificate and Social Security Card. WE MUST SEE THE ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS (Photocopies will be made for our files).
- D.C.F. Form #3040 (current Health Examination). This form may be obtained from your child's doctor. It verifies that your child is in good physical condition. The Health Examination Form is valid for (2) two years. This form must be in our office PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.
- D.C.F. Form #680 (current Immunization Certificate). This form may be obtained from your child's doctor. It verifies that your child has received the immunization required by the State of Florida. This form must be in our office PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.
- ³ Recent Report Card
- ³ Original Transcripts (High School Only)
- 3 Standardized Test Scores
- For students not residents of the U.S., one of the following items will be required: Alien Registration Card, Visa child holds, or Visa being applied for.
- All students entering Hope Academy will be required to take a Placement Exam.
- The parents or guardians of all new students entering Hope Academy Elementary, Middle, or High School are required to meet once with the school principal. Our administrators would like to explain the school's policies and philosophy.

School Procedures Clementary, Middle, and High School

School begins promptly at 8:30 a.m. Students must be dropped off at the pedestrian gate. A staff member will be there to assist and escort your child to class. Parents will not be allowed to escort students to class.

Dismissal

Dismissal will be via "drive-thru" only. Parents will not be allowed to walk in and collect their child(ren). Parents may drive up and request their child. Children will be escorted to their parents by their respective classroom teachers. If a child is not picked up by 3:30 p.m., he/she will be signed into After-School Care. A charge of \$5.00 will then incur. Kindergarteners must be picked up at 3:00 p.m. unless they are in After-School Care.

No Pick-ups between 2:00 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. Please wait for your child to be released to the dismissal area.



School Procedures (cont.)

Visitors

Due to COVID-19 rules and regulations, no one will be allowed to visit the school campus. Parents will be allowed to visit the school office by appointment only or in case of emergency.

* Notice: This property is under 24-hour video surveillance. *

Attendance

Good attendance and punctuality are essential to a successful school career. Consistent attendance and punctuality are habits that a child can learn early in life. At Hope Academy we strive to instill discipline in all children.

Absence

- ³ A child is considered absent if he/she does not attend school.
- A child is considered absent if he/she arrives at school after 9:30 a.m. without a legal note.
- A child is considered absent (half day) if he/she leaves school prior to 12:30 p.m.

All children who are absent must present a note from his/her parent or guardian stating the reason for their absenteeism. This note must be given to the homeroom teacher. If you are picking up your child early, you must report to the office and not to the classroom.

School Procedures (Cont.)

All students who are absent for more than three (3) days must have a doctor's note in order to receive an excused absence. Ten unexcused absences will result in automatic withdrawal. Ten excused absences throughout the school year must have an administrative approval in order for a student to be promoted to the next grade level. At this time parents may be required to attend a meeting.

Excused Absences

- 1. Illness
- 2. Medical and Dental Appointments
- 3. Funerals
- 4. Religious Holidays
- 5. Family Emergency (must be explained)



Tardiness 1

A student is considered tardy if he/she is not in the classroom by 8:30 a.m. The final bell rings at 8:30 a.m. Once the final bell rings the student is considered tardy. Please, periodically, synchronize your watches with the 8:30 a.m. bell.

A student who is tardy must have a signed note from his/her parent or guardian explaining the reason for the tardiness. Five unexcused tardy notices per semester will result in one unexcused absence for that semester.

Required Attendance: 180 school days.

If a child has **ten** (10) or more unexcused absences within the school year he/she will not be promoted.

School Procedures (cont.)

Homework

The school policy is to assign homework Monday thru Friday. Failure to complete assigned work will result in an "F" for that assignment.

General Assembly

Hope Academy will hold General Assembly every Wednesday. One student from each grade level will be selected to receive a Star Student / Citizenship Award every grading period.

Progress Reports

Progress Reports will be issued mid–semester.

Personal Belongings

Please do not allow your child to bring to school any unnecessary personal belongings; this includes toys, electronic equipment or the latest fads. Electronic items will be confiscated and returned at the end of the year. However, on their specific Show-And-Tell day, as designated by your child's teacher, your child may bring to school one item.

Please understand that the school cannot be responsible for lost or stolen items. Also please put your child's name on these items.

Please label all your child's belongings (lunch boxes, books, book bags, sweaters, etc.) with his/her name in permanent ink or marker to lessen the chances of items being lost. Please do not send your child to school with expensive jewelry. The school will not be responsible for lost or stolen jewelry.

CELL PHONES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON THE SCHOOL CAMPUS.

School Procedures (cont.)

Lunch Program

Lunch may be brought from home. A monthly menu will go home the week before the end of the month. Milk is served with meals. If for any reason your child cannot have milk, a note is required from the parent.

NO Microwave Lunches!! NO Fast Food Lunches!!





Parental Responsibilities

- 1. Parents need to make sure their child is at school by 8:30 a.m. so that they are not marked tardy.
- 2. Parents need to contact the school by 8:45 a.m. if their child is going to be absent for the day. Please remember to do this in order to save the office staff the often time-consuming effort to contact you.
- 3. Parents need to pick up their children (grades 1-12) by 3:30 p.m. unless they are in the After-School Care Program or they are attending a school function. Kindergarten children must be picked up by 3:00 p.m. unless in After-School Care.
- 4. Parents must sign report card envelopes and progress reports and return them to the student's homeroom teacher within 2 days of receiving them.
- 5. Parents need to call for homework and pick up worksheets and books when their student will be out longer than one day.
- 6. Parents need to meet with teachers, when requested to do so, to discuss student progress. You are strongly encouraged to initiate these meetings whenever you feel they are necessary. Teachers are available after school. Call to make an appointment so that you will not have to wait. All appointments should be made before 8:30 a.m. or after 3:30 p.m.
- 7. Dismissal: Students will not be released to parents between 2:00 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. Please wait until 3:00 p.m. for parent pick up.

School Procedures (cont.)

Emergency Contact

It is very important for us to have the name and phone number of someone who can be responsible for your child if we cannot reach you. This person should be able to come to school and pick up your child if necessary. Please be sure that the person you list has this understanding. If at any time your personal information changes, please notify the office immediately.

Health Guidelines

If your child is injured or becomes ill at school, you will be notified immediately. PLEASE KEEP US CURRENT REGARDING YOUR PHONE NUMBERS BOTH AT HOME AND WORK. This information is vital should an emergency arise.

Illness

- 1. If you suspect that your child is not well, please keep him/her at home, regardless of his/her desire to come to school. We ask that you do this out of consideration for his/her classmates.
- 2. If your child has had a fever, his/her temperature should be normal for twenty-four (24) hours before returning to school.
- 3. If your child has a cold, is coughing and has a runny nose, please consider that he/she may be contagious to others. Please keep your child home or make arrangements for his/her care until he/she recovers.
- 4. If your child has a rash, please keep him/her home and contact your doctor to find out the cause.
- 5. Our school staff administers medication to children upon parental request. However, guidelines for administering medication are very strict and will be followed consistently.
- 6. If your child has a temperature of 99.9 degrees F or above, you will be notified. You must pick up your child from school immediately. The Department of Health will be notified if you do not comply. Your child's temperature must be below 99.0 degrees F for 72 hours in order for him/her to return to school.





School Procedures (cont.)

There are several illnesses that are common occurrences in early-age school children. The following is a list of the most common childhood illnesses:

HEAD LICE

Please do not allow your child to bring combs, hats, or brushes to class, as this is a primary cause for the spread of head lice. Our staff will check each child before being readmitted to class to determine that he/she is completely free of head lice and/or nits.

PINWORM

Symptoms that this condition may exist include restlessness, irritability, fretful sleeping and rectal itching. Testing and treating this condition are very simple. It is important to follow all instructions included with medication to prevent re-infestation.

PINK EYE

Pink eye is a virus that is highly contagious. Signs and symptoms include red, watery and itching eyes. You can expect your child to be home approximately two (2) days during treatment.

CHICKEN POX

Noticeable symptoms include a rash or raised blisters containing watery fluid. You can expect your child to be home from seven (7) to ten (10) days.

RINGWORM

Ringworm is a contagious skin disease (hair, skin, & nails) caused by a fungus. Please keep your child home and contact a doctor immediately. The child will not be permitted to attend school until the condition is cleared. A doctor's note must be brought to the office upon the child's return to school.

If we respect and are considerate of each other, we will not send our children to school sick. Children will not be admitted to school and will be sent home if they exhibit any symptoms of illness. Please help us control and minimize the spread of infections to others by providing care for your child when he/she is sick. We have no facilities for isolating children at our school.

Medicine Authorization

Parents must complete and sign an authorization form for medication, which includes the child's name, name of the medication, amount/time/date to be given and your signature. The Florida Department of Children and Families regulations prohibit dispensing medication if it is not in its original container with the pharmacy label on the bottle, indicating the child's name. The only over the counter medication that can be administered is Tylenol. This must be administered with the parent's permission only. We will not administer more than two (2) medications per child on a given day.

School Procedures (cont.)

GRADING POLICY

Report cards will be sent home 4 times per year. Progress reports will be sent home midsemester. Report card envelopes and progress reports must be signed by parents and returned within 2 days.

School Procedures (cont.)

Dress Code

GENERAL APPEARANCE

Hope students are representatives of Hope Academy while they are in uniform, therefore it is expected that all students be appropriately attired each day.

- ³ All students are expected to dress in a modest and neat fashion.
- All students are expected to practice good hygiene.
- ³ All students are required to wear their shirts or blouses tucked in.
- ³ Girl's skirts and jumpers will not be short, but of a modest length. A modest length being no shorter than two inches from the floor when the student is kneeling.
- Students are not allowed to wear excessive jewelry. Students may wear one watch, one neck chain and (girls only) one pair of earrings. Earrings are not to be dangling, but studs. BOYS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO WEAR EARRINGS OF ANY KIND.
- Belts will not be long and hang from the waist. All pants and shorts will be worn at the waist.
- No gang related accessories will be permitted.
- No inappropriate body piercing.
- ³ No gold teeth
- No black tee shirts
- No electronic devices-I Pods
- No hooded sweaters/jackets are permitted.

School Procedures (cont.)

Hair

Boys must keep their hair trimmed so that it rests above the collar of the polo shirt. Students whose hair does not meet standards will be given a 48-hour warning by which time their hair must be cut to an appropriate length. No student will be admitted to school until this requirement is met. Inappropriate hair styles or coloring will not be permitted. The school reserves the right to ask the student to change any hair style or coloring deemed inappropriate.

School Procedures (cont.)

General Assembly (Wednesdays)

<u>Middle and High School:</u> Students must wear khaki or navy-blue pants and red polo shirts.

<u>Elementary:</u> **Girls** must wear the plaid skort, plaid jumper or khaki /navy blue pants and red polo shirts.

Boys must wear khaki/navy blue shorts or pants and red polo shirts.

P.C. Uniforms Mandatory for 1k-6th Grade Students

Top: Gold t-shirt with school name **Bottom:** Navy blue or black gym shorts (must be below the knee)

If a student does not wear his/her P.E. uniform, he/she will not be permitted to participate in P.E. and will receive an **F** for the day.

NO OTHER UNIFORM COLORS ARE ALLOWED.

Belts must be worn by boys/girls wearing pants or shorts.

Parents will be called immediately if their child is brought to school without the complete uniform. The student will be placed on in-house suspension until parents deliver the proper attire.

ALL STUDENTS – COLD DAYS ONLY (MANDATORY)

Sweater: Navy blue Sweatshirts: Navy blue Jackets: Navy blue

Logos are required on sweaters, sweatshirts, and jackets.

No colored leggings are allowed under skorts.

No colored long-sleeve shirts are allowed under uniform shirts.



School Procedures (cont.)

Student Rules

PREPARATION FOR CLASS

Students must be seated at their desks with necessary supplies before the tardy bell rings. Students will be charged the replacement cost of any books damaged or not returned at the end of the school year.

Students will:

- ³ Complete homework before class.
- ³ Complete class assignments as instructed by the teacher.
- ³ Contribute positively to class with comments and ideas.
- ³ Treat all class participants with respect.
- Raise their hand and wait to be recognized before speaking.

Students will not:

- Disturb the learning process of other students.
- ³ Perform personal errands during class time.
- Bring food or drink into the classroom, including gum or candy.
- ³ Use the school telephones unless authorized by office personnel.
- ³ Make calls during class time.
- Have visits by non-Hope Academy students.

CD's, CD players, I-Pods, media players, cameras, and cell phones are not to be brought to school. They will be confiscated and returned at the end of the school year. If a student is found to have electronic equipment a second time, the item will be confiscated and donated to Good Will.

School Procedures (cont.)

Discipline

Hope Academy endeavors to provide a learning environment in which a child is disciplined within moral principles.

Time-out and detention are our form of discipline for classroom and playground. "Time –out" means that the child is separated from the group for a short period of time. The child stays in time-out until he/she can calm down and stop the disruptive behavior. If the disruptive behavior continues, the child will be sent to the office to visit the Principal. Usually one trip to the office will solve the problem. However, if the disruptive behavior persists, the parent(s) will be called and a conference will be scheduled.

Detentions at Hope Academy will be served in the following categories:

ISOLATED SCHOOL LUNCH:

Elementary – 35 minutes in the classroom Middle/High School – 45 minutes in the classroom

- ³ Using inappropriate language
- ³ Shoving and pushing other students.
- ³ Failure to return progress report or report card envelope.
- Students out of uniform. Shirts not tucked in or unbelted pants or shorts. Skirts not at an acceptable level.
- Any other behavior that a teacher considers inappropriate.

Two detentions in one week will result in one (1) outdoor suspension.



School Procedures (cont.)

Suspension

If a student's behavior is excessively disruptive, aggressive, abusive, or disrespectful, a child may be suspended from attending school. If a child has an outdoor suspension, he/she is asked to stay home.

- ³ Excessive behavior problems (i.e. detentions not working)
- ³ Smoking on or around school grounds
- 3 Leaving school grounds
- ³ Skipping school
- ³ Profanity use of vulgarity and swearing
- ³ Any inappropriate style of dress, including body or hair painting, coloring, baggy clothes, etc.
- ³ Inappropriate dress or behavior while attending after school or athletic functions
- Smoking or drinking while attending after school, extracurricular or athletic functions
- ³ Fighting 5 days Suspension

School Procedures (cont.)

Expulsion

- Drug use or sales student will be turned over to the parents and police.
- Destruction or vandalism to school property, or that of a teacher or fellow student.
- Excessive behavior problems.
- Stealing property, regardless of value, that belongs to the school, a teacher or fellow student.
- Fighting on school grounds.
- Threats and/or abuse toward a teacher or staff member, including profanity or vulgarity.
- Failure to uphold academic integrity.

The Principal and faculty reserve the right to make random searches in order to ensure the safety of all students and members of staff.

Tuition Payments

Tuition

Your child's tuition is a yearly fee. However, for your convenience we divide the tuition into (10) ten equal payments. The first payment is due by August 1st. The final payment is non-refundable. The other (9) nine payments are due on the first of each subsequent month, ending with the month of May.

After-Care

All payments must be made the Friday before the first day of the week.

Late Fee Policy

If your payment is not received by the 1st of each month, your account will be assessed \$5.00 per day late fee. It is our policy that if a student's account is (2) two months outstanding by the 1st of the second month, that student will be taken out of school until the account is brought up to date. No student will be allowed to register for a new school year if there is an outstanding balance.

School Procedures (cont.)

Returned Check Policy

If your bank returns your check, you will be charged a \$25.00 returned check fee. Please understand that if we receive (2) two returned checks from your bank, we will require that you pay your account with cashier's check/money order for the remainder of the school year.

Transportation

Parents are responsible for transporting their children to and from the school.

Security

Our school operates on a security minded approach. Visitors to the building must check in the school office for approval to be in the building.

Children traveling throughout the building must travel in twos. Any person who doesn't have any business to conduct in the school will not be allowed to remain on the premises. Please do not leave unattended children or your purse or wallet in your car when picking up or dropping off your child(ren). Please understand that the school cannot financially replace your possessions.

Intramural Sports

Hope Academy participates with other schools our size in four different sports throughout the year: soccer, volleyball, softball, and basketball. All students in 5th through 12th grade are encouraged to participate. There will also be a junior soccer team for grades 1-4.

A student must maintain an overall "C" average during each marking period to be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities.

Considering recommendations from the faculty and staff, the Principal has the authority to make any student ineligible for any extracurricular activity.

School Procedures (cont.)

Student Council

Hope Academy maintains a Student Council comprised of a president and a vice-president from each class beginning with 3rd grade.

The purpose of the Student Council is to monitor the student body and conduct various fundraising activities.



Holidays will also be studied and celebrated in the months that they occur. We will have several "celebrations" in connection with holidays. We will depend on you for their success.





Field Trips

Classes will join from time to time to enjoy selected field trips. Please understand these are at the discretion of the individual teacher.
