Monaco America is a club for owners of certain models of Monaco Brand Motor Coaches. Although Monaco Coach Corporation sponsors the club and assist with many of the activities the club is actually chartered through the Family Motor Coach Association, or FMCA. FMCA is a large organization that is open to membership to owners of factory built motor homes. Because of the charter situation an individual must be a member of FMCA to be a member of Monaco America.

Why the arrangement with FMCA? FMCA, being a very much larger organization is able to provide more benefits for the motor coach owner than a smaller club. Insurance is a major part of these benefits but not just insurance programs for the individual member. FMCA also provides the necessary liability coverage that Monaco America must have to be able to stage the semi-annual rallies. These rallies are planned and operated with all volunteer help. Without this liability coverage the membership and the volunteer organizers would be left liable for any problems or accidents that may occur. Additionally, the rally parks that are utilized require this liability coverage before a rally can be held in their park.

In addition to the benefits provided directly to the FMCA membership the organization also holds it's own rallies. In addition to two FMCA International Rallies each year they have many regional rallies. The organization is divided in several regions throughout the United States. The individual clubs are then assigned to those regions based on the type club or area they cover. Monaco America is assigned to the FMCA International Area. A member of FMCA is welcome to attend any of the FMCA International or Area rallies. These are all publicized in the monthly magazine that is sent to all members.

So remember, each time you send in an application for a Monaco America rally or to renew your membership, not only do you need to provide your Monaco coach number you must also provide your FMCA membership number.

It's time to Saddle Up for the Texas Hill Country


Spring Monaco America Rally scheduled for May 17, 18 and 19, 2005 in Kerrville, Texas

The time has come to start your planning to attend the Spring Monaco America Rally. This rally will be May 17-19, 2005, at the Buckhorn Lake Resort, Kerrville, Texas.

Kerrville is truly a Hill Country paradise. The scenery is majestic and the people are friendly. Kerrville is located in the heart of the Texas Hill Country, where sparkling spring-fed creeks meander through the rugged terrain and rolling hills of the Guadalupe River Valley. Relatively close by are San Antonio and Fredericksburg. The Guadalupe River, along with a mild climate, provides the opportunity to enjoy many outdoor pursuits.

Kerrville offers many attractions to see. Included in these: National Center for American Western Art; The Hill Country Museum; Kerr Arts & Cultural Center; The Point Outdoor Theatre on the Guadalupe; Louise Hays Park.; Lost Maples State Natural Area; Ingram Lake and Dam. Several festivals are held in Kerrville throughout the year. Two such festivals being held in May, just following our rally, is the Kerrville Folk Festival and the Texas State Arts & Crafts Fair.

The Buckhorn Lake Resort is perfectly located in the heart of Texas Hill Country. It has everything a person would expect from a premiere RV Resort. Every site features complete landscaping, full hookups, and concrete pads. Designed with large rigs and rallies in mind, all guest will appreciate the wide paved roads and ease of access. Tech Topics by J. P. McVicker and Larry Leadbetter

Battery maintenance is a very important part of coach upkeep. Monaco covers this topic in great detail in The Owners Manual, Maintenance Manual, and also in the Dry Camping Guide.

The main point to a long living battery is tender loving care. The batteries water level should be checked a least monthly. If the water level goes below the battery plates the battery will be ruined. Always use Distilled water because contaminants in tap water will degrade the battery also. Don't over fill. The level should be about 3/8 inch below the top. An inexpensive battery filler will fill to the proper level every time and can be found at most auto stores. The battery connections should be free of corrosion and tight. If the vehicle is in storage when temps are below freezing a discharged battery will freeze. When cleaning the terminals and cable connections be sure to avoid contact with corrosion and battery acid. Wear protective glasses and gloves to be safe. A little time spent reading about this topic in the owner's manual will pay dividends in the future.
