The Fall 2005 rally was held October 18-20, 2005, at Beech Bend Park in Bowling Green, Kentucky. 102 coaches were in attendance and a good time was had by all. Almost half the coaches arrived early, some as early as the Wednesday of the week before, to get a jump on sightseeing and visiting with their friends.

For those who came in early a pot luck dinner was held on Sunday night. The food was plentiful and well up to the Monaco America standards. Monday evening was our opening get-together with light snacks and an open bar. Breakfast and Dinner were provided by a local caterer, Bar-B-Que Junction, Tuesday through Thursday.

Numerous vendors were in attendance, ready to provide you with those items to help personalize your coach. In addition Monaco Coach Corporation provided a parts truck and Monaco Wearables. Also, representatives of Cummins Diesel and Carefree of Colorado were there. The Carefree representative spent a large amount of his time working in the coach area making repairs and adjustments to everyone’s awnings. Monaco also provided several factory techs to perform repairs and maintenance on the coaches. These young people started work on Sunday afternoon and worked very diligently to get everything completed. Each coach owner was allowed to have two items taken care of with free labor cost.

Spring 2006 Rally Back Home in Monaco's Indiana May 16-18, 2006



The Spring 2006 rally, Back Home in Monaco's Indiana, has been set for May 16-18 at the Elkhart County Fairgrounds in Goshen, Indiana.

Nestled in Northern Indiana, the roots of Goshen are tracked back to the Amish and Mennonite heritage that settled the area in 1834. While you can still see Amish with horses and buggies on the streets, Goshen, is a dynamic community offering visitors many entertaining options.

Goshen is in the center of Amish Country making it the perfect home base for many visitors. It is just minutes from Shipshewana with 90 one-of-a-kind stores and the Midwest's largest flea market. Other highlights include a visit to Essenhaus Village in Middlebury with a 1,100-seat family-style dining room or a trip to the quaint Amish based community of Nappanee.

Arts and cultural heritage celebrated:

The local Amish heritage is celebrated at attractions and restaurants throughout the region. Additionally, Goshen is the home to a growing artisan community. Their work can be seen at many local guilds and The Old Bag Factory, a converted factory that is now home to many local artists, furniture makers and craftsmen. Goshen College also provides many cultural opportunities through their art and music programs.

Shopping includes antiquing, handcrafted furniture and a charming downtown shopping district:

Shopping in Goshen provides a variety of selections. Goshen's historic downtown, centered around a Greek Revival 19th Century courthouse, includes upscale clothing stores, gift shops, furniture stores, antique malls, coffee shops and even a chance to step back in time to an old-fashioned soda shop, the Olympia Candy Kitchen, that also offers a wide selection of their hand dipped chocolates.

There is a Farmer's Market open every Tuesday and Saturday to purchase the freshest produce from local farmers. The Old Bag Factory provides a wonderful collection of unique shops catering to more artistic interests, including fine handcrafted hardwood furniture. Antiquing is also popular with several stores located in the downtown and at Peddler's Village, a large antique mall. Also, there is a wide selection of dining from Applebee's to Chinese to Mexican and, of course, Amish.

Recreational trails and parks abound:

The Maple City Greenway, a network of bicycle/pedestrian paths and hiking trails, connects residential neighborhoods, schools, parks, the library and the downtown area. It is one of the most comprehensive systems of its type in the Midwest, spanning 10 miles.

Other attractions in the area:

There are many other attractions within a short driving distance of Goshen. These include Amish Acres/Round Barn Theatre; Bonneyville Mill; University of Notre Dame; Lake Wawasee; RV Museum; Studebaker National Museum; College Football Hall of Fame; and throughout Elkhart County—the RV Capital. In addition to the Monaco factories in the area many of the other coach manufactures are located in this area.

Some activities planned for the rally are: An Amish bake sale. Place an order one day and it will be delivered the next. Planned for Wednesday of the rally is an Amish dinner served in local Amish homes.

An application for the Spring 2006 Monaco America Rally is on the facing page of this newsletter. Additionally, it will be available in future editions of Lifestyle magazine, on the Monaco Coach Corporations website, and on the Monaco America website. Submit your application as early as possible and start making your plans to join with your fellow members of Monaco America at another great rally.

Tech Topics by Larry Leadbetter

Fire Safety

All of our motor homes come equipped with a smoke detector and carbon monoxide detectors and a fire extinguisher. It is good practice to evaluate whether these items are working properly.

Smoke Detector - Monaco recommends testing the smoke detector at least once a week when the motor home is in use, prior to each trip and when the motor home has been in storage. To test, just push the button for approximately 3 seconds. This tests the circuitry, horn and battery. When the battery voltage gets low the detector will beep and the battery will need to be changed. A good practice is to change the batteries when the time changes twice a year. Also additional smoke detectors could be installed to reduce the risk of smoke and fire injuries. Common causes of home fires are from smoking in bed, leaving children unattended, and using flammable cleaning fluids.

Carbon Monoxide Detector – Test the operation of these detectors after the motor home has been in storage, before each trip and at least once per week during use. LP leaks can cause death and or explosions if undetected.

Fire Extinguisher – There is a fire extinguisher at the entrance to the coach. It should be inspected at least once a month. Do not test it unless for practice, then replace or recharge it immediately. I have installed a second fire extinguisher in the bedroom because I spend at least 8 hours a day there and if a fire started in the front of the coach I would not be able to reach it. A club member, retired fireman, recommended a one that would fight 3 types of fire, electrical, liquids, and paper. (ABC type) The rating should be 2A:10BC. I found one at Home Depot a 3A:30BC for around 20 dollars. Also know where the egress window is and how to open it.
