A keen interest was shown by the members in how the coaches are built. Tech Topic by Larry Leadbetter:

Tire care when parking or storing your vehicle for prolonged periods

I recently parked our MH for 5 months this winter in Goodyear AZ. I was surprised to find some of the rubber compound had leached out on the ground from my tires although I was not parked on concrete and have tire covers. So I have done some searching and found this advice. Ideally, a vehicle in storage should be placed on blocks to remove all weight from the tires. If the vehicle cannot be put on blocks, follow these steps for tire protection:

Completely unload the vehicle so that minimum weight will be placed on the tires.

If blocking is not possible, inflate tires to recommended operating pressure plus 25%. Ensure that the rim manufacturer's inflation capacity is not exceeded.

- Be sure the storage surface is firm, clean, well drained and reasonably level.

Avoid moving the vehicle during extremely cold weather.
Move the vehicle at least every three months to prevent ozone cracking in the tire bulge area, as well as "flat-spotting" from the prolonged strain of sidewall and tread deflection. Flat spots usually disappear, when the tires warm-up, after a 25+ mile drive. Flat spotting, which occurs on vehicles not moved for six or more months, may not disappear.

- Adjust inflation before putting the vehicle back into service.
- Tires on vehicles stored out-of-doors, should be protected by opaque covers to prevent damage from sunlight.
- Care should be taken to avoid prolonged contact with petroleum based substances: oils, fuel, asphalt or concrete.

Hope this provides info for those that store or sit in place for long periods of time.
