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




Hello all, it was a pleasure to meet many of you at the recent Monaco America Rally at Marksville, LA. My background is engineering and designing submarine torpedoes for the Navy. I also am the Co Moderator, along with Bill Duckwitz, of the Monacoers Internet group.

Gary asked me to sit in on a part of his Tech Session, and to talk about tech items getting a lot of attention on the Monacoers group. During that session, I noted that the long ongoing issue with the Norcold 1200 series fridges was one of our hottest (no pun intended) Monacoers topics. Here's some background:

For several years now there has been a steady trickle of RV fires initiated by a failure in the Norcold fridges. In the RV development where I have my winter pad (Mt. Olive Shore) we have lost two rigs due to fridge fires. In the RV development next door, Mt. Olive Shores North, a Holiday Rambler in the RV port of a home caught fire and burned the RV and home to the ground. There have been several instances of rigs burning at night with loss of life. So, this is a real problem and needs to be treated seriously.

What happens in most cases is the fridge electric heater elements arc where they are in contact with the "boiler". That causes a breach of the boiler and the ammonia can escape. Ammonia (NH₃) decomposes into, among other things, Hydrogen and it's the hydrogen that initiates a fire.

Norcold was slow to respond, but finally came out with Recall 1 which put a thermister in the boiler stack. That proved to be "locking the door after the horse was gone" as folks were still having fires. Next, Norcold did some testing and found that if the lower boiler tubes reached 900 degrees F, that the temperature would continue rising until the boiler failed with a fire resulting. So Recall 2 was designed to put a thermister directly on the boiler lower tube and when it reached 900 F, the Recall 2 control would shut off all AC and DC power to the fridge. This loss of power stopped any LP flow, also.

We have had enough cases of boiler breaches, but no fire to know that Recall 2 does the job. It took 5 iterations of "fine tuning" before Norcold got it right, but the latest (Rev E) seems to be doing the job. We have seen boiler breaches, but no follow on fire.


By all means, if you have not had Recall 2 done, you should get it done immediately. You are risking burning down your RV and possibly loss or life if you ignore the problem.
