# Tech Topic - Blow-by (Slobber) Bottle

Diesel engines by virtue of the fact of their very high compression ratio, tend to allow compression/combustion gasses past the piston rings into the crankcase (blow-by the rings). All reciprocating internal combustion engines do this to some degree or other. These gases combine with oil in the crankcase and this mixture must go someplace, so Cummins provides a crankcase vent for this purpose. The problem with diesel pushers is that the cooling fan is located behind this vent and it can suck the oil mixture (fine mist) into the fan and distribute it, and all the dirt and road grime it picks up, onto the surface of the radiator and charge air cooler. Some engines have more of a problem with this than others.

I had to have a radiator replaced due to failure of the core to tank seams. When the failed radiator and charge air cooler were removed, the radiator was about 1/2 blocked by oil/dirt and road grime that was in a circular pattern matching the fan rotation in relation to the engine crankcase vent tube location. The charge air cooler had some buildup, but not nearly as much as the radiator. During this service, the charge air cooler was cleaned prior to reinstallation and I wanted to keep my new (expensive) radiator clean in the future.

The solution is simply, cheap and easy. Using a small Gatorade plastic bottle, I installed a simple plumbing fitting into a hole punched in the bottle's top. To this fitting I installed a length of rubber hose (auto heater hose) connecting it to the outlet of the engine crankcase breather tube with a hose clamp on each end. Finally, I punched 3 small holes in the upper neck of the Gatorade bottle so as not to pressurize the bottle.

Now, as I roll merrily down the road, the oil mist collects in the bottle and settles to the bottom where it can be periodically visually checked and emptied when necessary.

This is about as cheap and easy a technical fix, to a problem that many of us are unaware of, as there is. When I told my wife about my accomplishment, she said "Fine, Now if I could only get a slobber bottle for you..."
