# **Annual Meeting October 9th Quorum Needed to Approve Business**

This year's Annual Meeting will convene 6:00 pm Thursday, October 9th, at Library 21c. An email notice to owners included 2024 Minutes, 2026 Proposed Budget, Board Nomination Form, Election Ballot, and Proxy Form. Please send in the Proxy if you can't attend as it will help make quorum. The 2026 Proposed Budget remains the same, meaning the Annual Assessment will remain at \$365 (see below). The budget is automatically approved unless 104 (67%) homeowners vote to reject it (Covenants 10.4). Two new officers will be elected to replace Sharon Wood and Heather Evans who honorably completed their 3-year terms. Nominations may be submitted in advance or at the meeting (ByLaws IV.4). Positions are decided among the Board Members within 10-days of election (ByLaws V.2 & IV.7). All homeowners are welcome.

Colorado Springs Ordinance 4.4.104 says branches may hang no lower than 8-feet above the surface of a sidewalk. Homeowners are responsible for keeping their trees and bushes pruned to comply with City Ordinance.



#### **Become a Deer Creek Board Member**

The Board of Directors is essential for transacting the business of the neighborhood. It's not hard, but it does require commitment. You must meet at least once quarterly and attend the Annual Meeting. The primary purpose of the Board is to help sustain property values by maintaining common areas and enforcing standards. This means contracting lawn services, interacting with homeowners, and sometimes (rarely) taking legal action. The Board also ensures the HOA complies with State law. This means submitting tax forms for a nonprofit agency, keeping insurance, and contracting an annual audit. The Board also supports safety and quality of life by contracting trash services and promoting community events like the annual Garage Sale and Picnic. All this requires time, effort, and money. To assist the Board in these matters, the HOA contracts the professional services of RowCal. They provide critical support with finances and experienced operating advice. #### **Ruling Looms Over Ford Amphitheater**

On September 11<sup>th</sup>, the Colorado Supreme Court ruled that public government can't issue sound waivers to private agencies. The decision was made on a case in Salida, but is expected to impact the future of concerts at Ford Amphitheater which was granted noise waivers by the City of Colorado Springs. The amphitheater's attorney says \$1.5 million in noise mitigation improvements should keep them within legal limits.

# **Bear Sightings Around Deer Creek**

Bear sightings have been a rare occurrence in Northgate, but this year's rain has resulted in a bumper crop of acorns attracting bears down from the foothills. Nextdoor.com has reported bears both north and south of Deer Creek. Despite appearances, bears can be dangerous especially if a mother is protecting her cub. If you see one, do not engage, walk back the way you came. Do not endanger yourself. Do not force Wildlife to have to kill the bear. Protect both you and the bear.

# **October Lawn Maintenance Tips**

In October, Colorado Springs lawn care is focused on preparing your yard for winter and ensuring it thrives. Fertilize in mid to late October to help grass survive. Water only as necessary. Check hydration by inserting a screwdriver into the ground. It if slides easily, then it's hydrated. Aerate to help nutrients reach the roots. Rake leaves and remove them to reduce dead patches and disease. Finally, winterize your sprinkler system to avoid costly repairs next spring.
