## Definitions

The following definition of EFO terms is here in support of the ongoing Editors Corner series on EFO's.

## EFO is the shorthand for

"Error, Freak, or Oddity". It's a term applied to philatelic items that were formed unintentionally abnormal.

Errors: Are usually "major" errors having catalog status where something in the process has gone entirely wrong. Examples of "errors" are consistent, unintentional deviations from the normal and typically are stamps that are wrongly perforated, both between or completely imperforated, FULL color(s) omitted, inverts, multiple impressions, missing watermarks or tagging and FULL stamps on either side of an interpane gutter, etc.

Freaks: Also called "varieties", are generally defined as a lesser degree of production problem. Typically freaks have flaws that are not consistent or do not have catalog status. Examples of freaks include ink smudges, off center perforation shifts, partially missing colors or color shifts, pre-printing paper folds, paper creases, over or under inked stamps, and so forth. Freaks often sell for less than their "error" counterparts. Printing plate cracks, wear and other flaws such as repairs or re-entries are freaks and not typically considered to be errors.

## EFOs Part XI <br>  Stamp Collecting SHIFTED COLOR VARIETIES

U.S. Scott \#1474 was issued on November $17^{\text {th }}, 1972$ in the city of New York. It was issued in recognition of a hobby that is both educational and fun - and in response to numerous requests that collectors have a "stamp of their own."

From the mid 1800's to the present, stamp collecting has provided a source of pleasure and education to countless millions of people of all ages. According to the BEP ( Bureau of Engraving and Printing ), "Stamps have been involved in American history: The patriots of the American Revolution would not allow British ships to unload the Revenue Stamps brought here to be affixed to bales of tea" U.S. stamps have been a diary of history, via Commemorative stamps documenting important historical people places and things.

Oddifies: The catch-all category for anything that is left. Oddities are often very subtle problems and do not have catalog status. Examples of oddities can be cancel and plate varieties, inverted USPS cancellations, very minor perforation shifts, minor color shifts, and so forth. Most oddities are a curiosity and have lower EFO values.

There will continue to be a debate about the definition of freaks and oddities. This is one area where a classification can be a matter of personal opinion.
A frequent area of debate is over pre-printing paper folds. The debate centers on how minor (oddity) or how major (freak) a fold is. As it turns out, one mans freak, is a another mans oddity.

For more information on definitions of and values for many EFOs. Please see the Stephen R. Dazt book, "Catalogues of Errors on US Postage Stamps."

Believe it or not, stamps have had lasting Geopolitical impacts on all of us. In the case of the Panama Canal and before Panama was selected as the permanent site of the canal system between the Atlantic and Pacific oceans, most of the U.S. Senators favored a shorter Nicaraguan route. Clever lobbyists for Panama utilized the stamps of Nicaragua, specifically stamps picturing the Momotombo Volcano with ash spewing from its crater as very effective propaganda. The Lobbyists circulated copies of the stamps to the Senators and in doing so they were able to convince them that the treat was significant enough to menace the proposed Nicaragua Canal. As if on cue, the Volcano did in fact erupt twice in both 1902 and $1905 .{ }^{1}$

The U.S. stamp \#1474 depicts the U.S. stamp \#1, an 18475 cent Franklin under the magnifying glass of a collector. The 1972 stamp celebrates the adoption of adhesive postage stamps by the Post Office Department in 1847. 125 years prior to its release, these adhesive stamps ushered in a new age of convenience to users of the mails and served as the wellspring of this most popular hobby. Scott \#1474 was printed by the BEP and is characterized by a black and multicolored lithographed, engraved stamp issue in perforation 11. There were approximately 166 million of these stamps printed in 1972.

## SHIFED COLOR EFO's -- The Scott \#1474 SHIFTED COLOR

 variety is a bit ironic and a humorous coincidence given that the EFO variety is on a Stamp Collecting issue!The 1972 8c "Stamp Collecting" stamp was issued with two engraved colors, brown (Ben Franklin stamp [U.S. \#1)] and a black (magnifying glass). Many of the EFOS for this issue are characterized by the shifting of one or both of these engravings. The following example has the black and brown portions of the engravings shifted down. The (Freak) has the base of the magnifying glass extending out below the bottom margin of the stamp. This type of "printing freak" variety is generally limited to only one or a couple sheets of stamps. The stamp is both interesting and visually appealing.
