## Stamp on Page 1

The Stamp Image on page one is The rarest and most valuable stamp in the world - the British Guiana 1c Magenta, which has an estimated value $\mathbf{\$ 9 , 4 8 0 , 0 0 0}$
U.S. it was last sold on 17 June, 2014. A delivery of stamps from London to British Guiana in 1856 was delayed so the 1c Magenta was created to ensure the continued trade and communication on the island. The fact that there is only one known copy existing makes this stamp a real rarity.

PSC Past President STEVE TWENGE knows United Nations Stamps. He really knows United Nations Stamps!! "Look for the star-punch or the L-punch on the margins of the 1950s issues. Many UN stamps are deeply out-of-favor and selling as low as $20 \%$ of face value but the punch varieties sell at huge premiums." But wait, there's more! The UN 1 1/2c PRECANCEL is another GEM floating around out there in mixtures and albums for pennies but sells for $\$ 20$ to $\$ 50$ or more in excellent condition. And how about the UN FIFTEENTH ANNIVERSARY SOUVENIR SHEET! (Scott \# 85) You can buy many at less than a dollar each at local stamp shows. But look carefully because the easily-seen "broken I and broken V" varieties are worth up to $\$ 40$ on eBay!

Steve will provide pictures of these hidden gems in a future issue of the Poway Stamp Club Newsletter. In the meantime he is looking for AUTOGRAPHS OF FAMOUS PEOPLE. ## Editors Corner

## "Philosateleia"

While perusing the Internet for sites of philatelic interest. I happened on a site identified as www.philosateleia.com. Philosateleia was created and is maintained by Mr. Kevin Blackston of San Antonio TX. His site is an interesting and eclectic mix of Philatelic interests. Of note Philosateleia provides visitors a number of valuable freebies, including access to free album pages. Beyond the free pages, the site introduces its visitors to the concept of the "Local Post" and the production of Fantasy/Cinderella stamps.

So what does Philosateleia mean? As, Kevin puts it "Philosateleia is a combination of two Greek words, "philos" (loving) and "ateleia" (exemption from tax). The term philately, which refers to the collection and study of postage stamps, is derived from those two words."

I reached out to Kevin in late February 2019 for the Poway Stamp Club, to better understand his site and philatelic interests. I have included his responses below and some additional information about the information and products available at his site.

## Kevin Blackston wrote:

"I've been collecting stamps since I was around 10 or 11 years old-probably 1992, though I don't know for certain. At the beginning I was a worldwide collector, but eventually narrowed my focus to United States stamps. Besides my general US collection, I'm especially interested in the $14 \phi$ American Indian stamp from the fourth Bureau issue, and I've also been building a thematic collection of stamps picturing natural landscapes (mountains, rivers, etc.) around the world. I joined the APS around 2001.

Early on in my collecting career, I used a couple of different commercial stamp albums, but eventually grew dissatisfied with them and began creating my own album pages. In 2006, I began offering The Philosateleian, my free-to-download set of United States stamp album pages, and I've issued updates for that four times per year ever since. I actually released my first supplement for 2019 earlier today.
While the free stamp album pages are without question the biggest
draw to Philosateleia, I also blog on various stamp topics that capture my fancy and share images of some of the items in my collection. Last year I undertook a major update of my site that gave me the ability to sell duplicates and unneeded material; I'm not a dealer, but I appreciate having an outlet for stamps with insufficient catalogue values to justify listing on eBay.

I don't remember exactly how I became interested in creating Cinderella stamps, but I started using my first Philosateleian Post local post stamp in 2004, and have produced one to three designs per year ever since then. (I'm currently the editor of the Local Post Collectors Society's bimonthly newsletter, The Poster.) In 2014, I acquired an antique Franklin perforating machine so that I could perforate my local post stamps; in 2016, I had the opportunity to acquire a slightly larger Southworth model, and have been using that ever since. In addition to my Philosateleian Post stamps, I've created fantasy stamps for the Republic of Texas and the Roman Empire, neither of which ever issued stamps, of course.

I like being able to commemorate topics of importance to me (e.g., the birth of my daughter, my favorite national parks, etc.), but more importantly, I enjoy "playing postmaster," cancelling my stamps and stamping the date of mailing on envelopes and the like. While I don't consider myself to be an artist or even a particularly creative individual, I think designing Cinderella stamps gives me the opportunity to be a little bit creative. Finally, coming up with my own designs has given me a much greater appreciation for a well designed stamp because I understand firsthand how challenging it can be to come up with a design that works well in such a small format!

I've had a number of people ask me how to start a local post, and it's quite easy, really--decide on a name for your local post, come up with a stamp design, print multiple copies of it, and start attaching those "stamps" to your outgoing mail. My experience has been that as long as you affix appropriate US postage to your outgoing mail, the USPS doesn't care what other stickers or labels of your own creation are attached."

Beyond his fulltime job as an IT professional, Kevin is a member of the American Philatelic Society, the Local Post Collectors Society, and the San Antonio Philatelic Association.

## Philosateleia's Fantasy and Cinderella Stamps

## Republic of Texas fantasy stamps

The Republic of Texas existed only from 1836-46, becoming the 28th state in the United States of America a year before the USA issued its first postage stamps. Texas never had its own stamps, but it did have a functioning postal system that was established even before independence was formally declared.
Although the Republic of Texas did not produce postage stamps, Philosateleia's editor imagined that an initial set of definitives might have looked like these. These Cinderellas were produced in sheets of 14.

For the first anniversary of the Battle of Gonzales, the fledgling republic could have issued a set of stamps commemorating the Battle of Gonzales. The vignettes of these cinderellas reproduce the basic design of the "Come and Take It" flag used by Texan settlers.


Battle of Gonzales commemoratives

The denominations of these fantasy stamps are based on actual postage rates that were in effect during the early years of the Republic of Texas:

| Denomination | Distance |
| :---: | :---: |
| 61/4¢ | up to 20 miles |
| $121 / 2 ¢$ | 20-50 miles |
| 183/4¢ | 50-100 miles |
| 25 ¢ | 100-200 miles |
| $371 / 2 ¢$ | 200+ miles |

## United Nations Decoded

## Interesting United Nations Cover

When looking at covers or collections, you should be on the lookout for the United Nations New Your Number 2a. The 2 a is the $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cent precancelled. The only precancelled issued by the United Nations in its 79 year postal history issued in 1951, the 2a had a printing of 317,000 as compared to regular issue printing of $7,450,000$.

In your search, it is best to find the 2 a on the envelope issued by UNESO. The envelope should have the following code printed on the front (SEC. 34.66 P. L. \& R.)

For the ultimate find and rarity, look for margin inscription bock of 4 or 6 as well as an envelope that has a "persons" return address. The $11 / 2$ cent precancelled should make a nice addition to your odds and ends collection.

Post Office Transcontinental Railroad Stamps
May 10 | Promontory Summit, UT | Pane of 18 Stamps

Three new stamps mark the 150th anniversary of the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad, a massive engineering feat that reduced travel time across the country from as many as six months to about one week and made the American West an integral part of the nation.

Two different stamps feature the Jupiter and the No. 119 locomotives that powered the trains carrying the officers and guests of two train companies to the "Golden Spike Ceremony," held when the two rail lines were joined at Promontory Summit in Utah. A third stamp portrays the famous golden spike that was used for the historic final connection, and was a prominent part of the ceremony.


Wild and Scenic Rivers Forever stamps


May 21, 2019 | Bend, OR | TBD
Wild and Scenic Rivers celebrates Scenic Rivers and American streams that run freely through natural landscapes without man-made alterations. The pane of a dozen different designs features photographs that represent the more than 200 rivers or river segments designated within the Wild and Scenic Rivers System. First row, left to right: Merced River, Owyhee River, Koyukuk River Second row, left to right: Niobrara River, Snake River, Flathead River Third row, left to right: Missouri River, Skagit River, Deschutes River Fourth row, left to right: Tlikakila River, Ontonagon River, Clarion.
