February Guest Speaker

David C. Carey is the Defense Commissary Agency's West Area Director, headquartered at McClellan, California. He has oversight of 60 commissaries, divided into six zones in 15 states. The area's annual sales exceed \$1.1 billion. He was appointed to this position effective Jan. 5, 2020, after serving since 2011 as Pacific Area Director.



Carey served on active duty in the Air Force from 1982 to 1992, holding positions with the Air Force Commissary Service. During Operation Desert Storm he was deployed to Saudi Arabia and Bahrain.

He entered civil service in 1992 at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas, and has continued to work to forward commissary operations overseas and in the U.S. Early in his civil service career he served as store director for several commissaries to include one of DeCA's largest stores, Fort Bragg, North Carolina. As DeCA's Zone 6 Manager, he was responsible for the operations of 11 commissaries in Texas. As DeCA West Director of operations he provided technical operations guidance for 113 commissaries and eight central distribution centers.

Beginning in 2009, as Deputy Director of DeCA West, he had oversight of 45 commissaries in the Pacific Theater, Alaska, Hawaii and Washington.

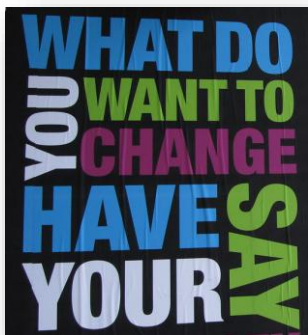

Legislative Update

James "Skip" Phair, Legislative Director

[SB-694 The Veterans Benefits Protection Action](#), Senator Bob Archuleta, is due to hit the Senate floor any day now. We need your action today. **Please call or email your State Senator this month.** The bill will be voted on by the California State Senate as early as 9 January. Every State Senator needs to be inundated with messages from you and other constituents to vote for passage of Sb 694. The opposition is paying multiple lobby firms to defeat or table it.



SB 694 requires individuals and businesses who assist veterans with VA claims to be VA accredited and follow Federal Law for any fees. A violation in California will be a deceptive practice under the Consumer Legal Remedies Act which can result in civil or legal penalties. Despite VA cease and desist orders, an investigation by National Public Radio reported that

the 20 plus firms engaged in unaccredited VA claims processing revenue is over \$73 billion a year. The top four firms spent \$4 million lobbying in 2024.

“Hello, I am calling to ensure my voice is heard in support a very important bill to protect veterans. SB 694. This bill will ensure veterans are not ***illegally*** charged for a first-time application for disability benefits. I fought hard and served this country and these Claim Sharks - who have NO oversight and are not accredited or licensed -now want to charge me unbelievable amounts of money to file an application for my benefits – benefits I earned through my service.

SB 694 will stop this illegal practice and protect veterans from fraud and abuse. ALL congressionally chartered veteran organizations and hundreds of other veteran groups and veterans support this bill. There are plenty of accredited Veteran Service Organizations who can help and DO NOT charge veterans for this help. Senator, will you stand with us Veterans and support SB 694? Thank you.”

Organize Your Personal Affairs

The start of every year marks a new beginning and whether or not you are into resolutions, it is the perfect time of year to assess your personal affairs and organize them (or perhaps make a few adjustments). Organizing your personal affairs involves creating a centralized, secure system for all important documents, finances, and end-of-life plans.

Key Areas to Organize:

- Financials: List all bank accounts, investments, credit cards (with numbers), loans, and mortgages.
- Benefits: Document retirement plans, pensions, and health benefits from current/past employers.
- Insurance: Note all policies (life, auto, home, health) with policy numbers, agents, and contacts.
- Property: Keep deeds, titles, and lease agreements for real estate, vehicles, etc..
- Taxes & Legal: Store tax records and preparer info; include wills, trusts, and advance directives.



Steps to Take: Gather & Document: Collect all vital documents and list them out in detail.

- Secure Storage: Use a fireproof safe or locked filing cabinet; consider adding plastic sheet protectors for documents. If you are using an electronic storage system, ensure your login and password information is accessible if you can't provide it and that the electronic system doesn't become obsolete.
- Inform a Trusted Person: Tell a trusted friend or relative where these organized documents are located, but not necessarily the details within.
- Get Legalities in Order: Meet with an attorney or military legal assistance office to draft a will and advance directives (power of attorney for health/finances).
- Discuss Wishes: Talk to family and your doctor about end-of-life preferences and care.
- Create a Master List: Develop an "end-of-life" planner or binder that consolidates all this info.
- Review Annually: Update your organized files and plans every year.

January 2026 – What Will the New Year Bring?

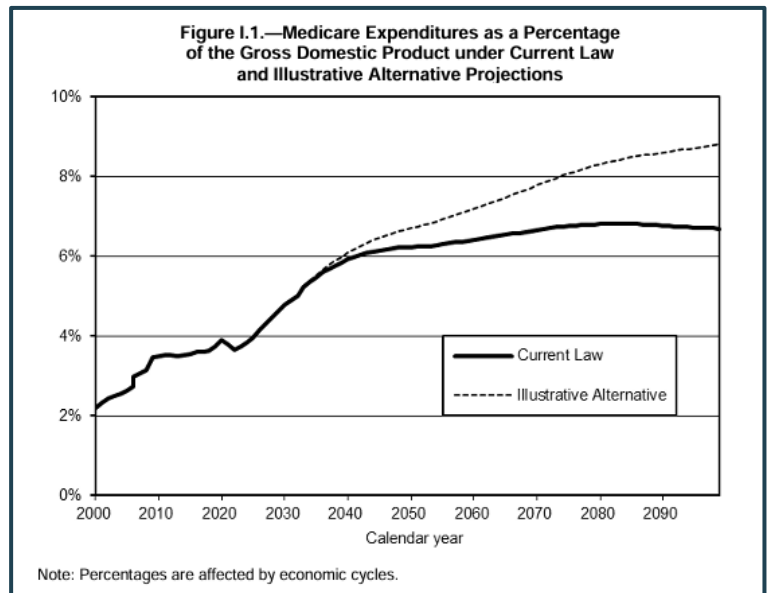
I would like to start by wishing everyone a happy and healthy New Year! As always, with every new year comes changes; some are welcomed and others are not. One of the things we do not welcome is cost increases. Medicare premiums have gone up as we all will see on our Social Security payments. This will increase each year according to the information below.

Medicare Premium Cost Increases: The standard Medicare Part B monthly premium could nearly double over the next nine years, according to [the annual report from the program's trustees](#), reaching \$347.50 by 2034 – up from \$185 this year.

The report projects a \$206.50 premium for next year. The \$21.50 year-over-year increase from 2025 to 2026 would be the largest among the projected hikes until 2033. A look at the full projection:

- **2026**: \$206.50
- **2027**: \$218.60
- **2028**: \$231.30
- **2029**: \$247.40
- **2030**: \$264.70
- **2031**: \$281.60
- **2032**: \$300.80
- **2033**: \$325.90
- **2034**: \$347.50

The report's projections are significantly higher than last year's report, which topped out at a \$299.80 monthly premium estimate in 2033. Higher premiums are connected to higher-than-anticipated Part B-related outlays; the report points to "higher projected spending for outpatient hospital and physician-administered drugs" as the key cost driver.



For those who may be interested in completing your education, the following benefit is available:

Enrollment verification for VA Education benefits required starting January 2026

Starting in January 2026, all Department of Veterans Affairs education beneficiaries, including Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance (Chapter 35) students will be required to verify their enrollment each month to receive their benefit payments. Please note that you must verify your enrollment for the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to begin processing your monthly benefit. Once verified, payment processing can take five to seven calendar days.

You can learn more about the different enrollment verification methods on the Verify Your School Enrollment webpage. If you have questions about your enrollment, please contact your School Certifying Official. You can find their contact information listed on the GI Bill Comparison Tool.

Membership in National MOAA

All our 2025 members who are eligible for national MOAA membership are members of MOAA at the national level except for our two newest Active-Duty members. Forty-two are LIFE members and seventeen are Premium members at the national level. Fourteen (including 3 Active-Duty Members) of our Chapter members are “Basic” members of MOAA at the national level. MOAA is encouraging all “Basic” members to become either “Premium” or “LIFE” members, i.e., dues paying members.

It is important that Chapter members who are Premium (Annual) members of national MOAA keep their national MOAA membership current with the payment of annual dues; or upgrade to “LIFE” membership in national MOAA.

Please visit the national MOAA website <https://www.moaa.org> . It provides current information of significance to military personnel, active, former and retired and to spouses of military personnel; and it is easy to navigate. Access to much of the MOAA website requires logging in as a MOAA member. To do so, you will need to enter your MOAA membership number, and you will have to create a password. Life Membership: LIFE membership costs vary from \$921 for someone 49 years old or less to \$107 if you are 95 to 99 years old. If you are over 100, LIFE Membership is FREE. LIFE membership passes to your spouse if you predecease your spouse.
