

Laura completed her graduate training at New York City's Neighborhood Playhouse School of the Theatre in 2007. Laura previously served as associate artistic director of The Real Theatre Company in New York City, which produced a 40th anniversary production of Hair! In collaboration with the play's creator James Rado and went on to create an extensive educational outreach program for New York City schools. The company also workshopped and produced multiple new works, including US, an original musical in collaboration with musician Peter Gabriel. Laura was a founding member of The Collective Theatre Company in New York City, which produced the first New York reading of her play, Prisoners. From 2018-2022, Laura served as the Executive Director of Argenta Community (now Contemporary) Theater. She has worked extensively as an actor, director and playwright in New York City and Europe, as well as in local and regional theatre and film and also teaches acting for adults and teens. Laura currently serves as the Director of Outreach and Development for Arkansas Hospice Foundation, and the Marketing Director for Riverside Actors Theatre. Executive Producing Artistic Director

Mark A. Burbank is a multi-hyphenate creative (producer/ director/ performer/designer). educator, and artivist. They hail from Little Rock, AR, but have directed, performed, and taught around the country. Mark is also the Co-Founder and Producing Artistic Director of Actors Theatre of Little Rock. Mark is no stranger to the stage having over 80 production credits ranging from community, education, and professional productions. Previously, they were the Associate Artistic Director and Executive Director of The Studio Theatre, where they have directed and produced eleven productions, including Songs for a New World, Mamma Mia, A Christmas Story: the musical, and Dogfight. Other directing projects include Parade and Mary Poppins at the Royal Theatre, Young Frankenstein with the Community Theatre of Little Rock, and Johnny Appleseed with Missoula Children's Theatre. Mark spent the covid year teaching theatre at Little Rock Central High School, and has taught classes and workshops in acting, dance, singing, and auditioning with schools and theaters around the country. Mark is also an accomplished designer, choreographer, musical director, and actor. Favorite acting credits include Tony (West Side Story), Squidward (The Spongebob Musical), Anthony (Sweeney Todd), Prince Dauntless (Once Upon A Mattress), Jeffery (Godspell), Prince Topher (Cinderella), Enjolras (Les Miserables), and Rolf (The Sound of Music). Mark is a graduate of the University of Central Arkansas.

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
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
