Dear Brothers, Sisters, and Partners in the Gospel,

Our hearts are full of gratitude for your continued prayers and generosity. By God’s grace and your faithfulness, the second phase of our home is nearly complete! What once was just a vision on paper is now reality!

Thank you for building with us—brick by brick, prayer by prayer.

As we look toward the future, we are seeing with increasing clarity the need to begin **Phase Three** and eventually finish the home with Phases Four and Five. This isn’t just about walls and roofs. It’s about care. It’s about children. It’s about family and restoration.

Right now, our boys’ home is filled with a **brave couple, a helper, and 14 beautiful children**. While they love deeply and serve tirelessly, we’ve come to see that this number can stretch the limits of what even the most devoted caregivers can provide. Each child needs more than just food, safety, and shelter—they need **presence**, they need **heartfelt attention**, they need **discipleship in the everyday moments**.

In recent months, we’ve watched some of our boys wrestle with wounds too deep to be mended in group settings alone. We’ve seen the tears, the meltdowns, the withdrawal—These are our children. We want to give them better. We believe that if we can get into these new homes, we can better care for and meet the needs of each child. Rosbibelex has been one of these children. He had been ok and manageable during his first 8 months with us. You see, it was Omar, Rosbi’s older brother, who first came to our home. And before that, their older sister was selling things in the street and eventually ended up with the police. All of the children were then taken from their mother, who was not caring for them



but rather using them. They were eventually given back to her, and soon after that, she abandoned Omar at the local child protective services and took her other children with her to an institution who aimed to help her get on her feet. There, Rosbi was very disruptive, caused some problems in that home, and was also eventually moved to our home. Omar was very happy to have his brother with him here at Casa de Mi Padre, and we were happy to have them both with us. After 8 months though, multiple things have happened. Rosbi started having focal seizures, and the boys had their first court hearing to see if there were any family members who could take them. They got to see their mother but were not able to go live with her. After these two events, Rosbi has started to have major meltdowns, inconsolable fits, and even bit a teacher at one point. We have been doing what we can, we are constantly praying and studying new techniques. And he, as all our children do, is meeting with our psychologist who works full-time at Casa de Mi Padre.

We will keep praying and doing what we can, but I can't help but imagine that if our couple had less children, less home, less studies to oversee, they could give better care and they could better focus on him and the fewer number of children in their home, and maybe, just maybe, that may make the difference.

With your help, we are asking God to enable us to finish building the additional homes in our construction project so we can care for **smaller family groups of 6–8 children each**. We believe this model will allow for more **intentional, healing relationships**, and reflect more closely the tender, shepherding heart of our God.

We know the road ahead requires faith, resources, and labor—but we believe this is the next faithful step. We're not merely expanding a building—we're deepening the impact of love.
