Why Privacy Matters

- Every click, post, or search leaves a digital trace.
- Those traces build a picture of who you are
 - Habits
 - Interests
 - Locale
 - Relationships
 - Even moods
- Once something is shared, it can spread or stay online for years.

What You Reveal Without Realising

- Check-ins show where you go
- Comments show what you care about
- Photos show who you're with
- Usernames connect your accounts
- Birthdays hint at passwords

Oversharing Examples

- Posting your holiday while you're away
- Sharing photos with your house or car visible
- Celebrating with your birthday or age in captions
- Tagging friends' kids or workplaces without asking
- Sharing screenshots that include private info

Privacy Settings Tips

- Review who can see your posts "Friends" beats "Public."
- Turn off location tagging when you don't need it.
- Limit what apps can access your photos and contacts.
- Check what's visible on your profile to non-friends.
- Audit old posts hide or delete what you no longer want public.
