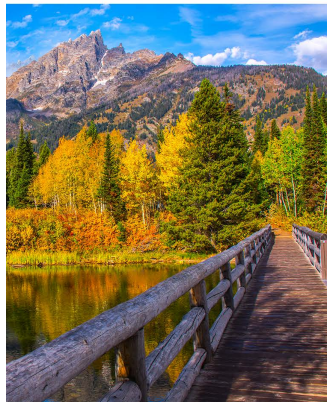
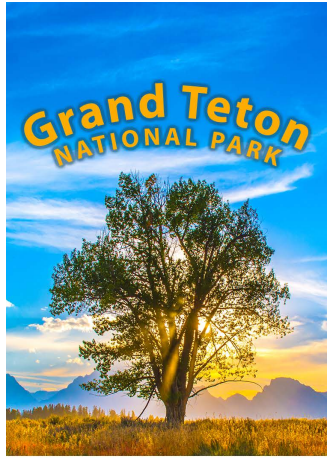

FUN FACTS TO KNOW & TELL
 Founded in 1929 by President Calvin Coolidge
 Startlingly spectacular pristine setting in NW Wyoming
 310,000 acres/45 miles long by 26 miles wide
 Youngest mountain range in the Rockies
 Sawtooth-looking Schist and Gneiss rock mountains
 Highest/lowest Grand Teton (13,770' / Fish Creek (6320'))
 6 peaks over 12,000 feet, 7 Moraine lakes & 100+ alpine lakes
 Jackson Lake is largest (25,450 acres or 15 miles x 8 miles)
 Average Precipitation 21.6" per year, Hi/Lo Temps 97°F / -63°F
 Highly adaptive variety of park flora and fauna
 242 miles of hiking trails, 7 campgrounds, 5 visitor centers
 Mini Ice Age occurred 1400 to 1850 of the common era
 There are about a dozen small alpine glaciers remaining
 This area's greatest Pindale Glaciers began receding 11,000 years ago
 First humans followed migrating herds through this area at that time

NATIVE AMERICANS
 It is thought that approximately 500 years ago, the Shoshone people established permanent settlements in this area. Very spiritually connected to this land, they built stone structures that archaeologists found in the upper areas of the Grand Teton. One common ritual that the Plains peoples practiced was to send their young men on vision quests. It was expected that this would be the time they would gain a vision of their guardian spirit. Perhaps this was the use of these stone structures in the areas highest regions.
