Park Report: Sara reported 27,100 visitors in June, a slight drop from 2020. The Nature Center is open, merchandise is being sold. Over the weekend of July 4, a few capacity closures were experienced. The trail ambassador program is underway, with 12 volunteers thus far. The fire pit is completed, but still needs a lockable cover. South Cave Point Drive has many pot holes, some of the repair may be funded by the WFB Homeowner's Association.

Treasurer's report: Julia reported a generous donation from Carl and Ruth Scholz. It was voted (Don/Jim) to apply this gift to the brachiopod trail project. Despite the pandemic closure, the fiscal year ended with a \$15,324 increase, about half of which comes from the kayak concession. Income for June was \$1,102.08. Expenditures were \$712.27. The balance in the checking account is \$35,557.37. \$31,698.97 (mostly for designated projects) is in the savings account.

Membership: Renewal notices were mailed/emailed in May, resulting in 4 new life memberships and a few donations. Susan is planning an end-of-July newsletter. She has email addresses for most members.

Doug asked about insurance liability for the kayak concession and was assured that the contract had been signed off on by a DNR attorney. He also asked about expanding membership. Susan has made an outreach effort to the WFB and Clark Lake Associations.

Candlelight Walk: This is now scheduled to coincide with the full moon, Aug. 21, 7:30 to 9 pm.

A new book store manager may be needed. John will contact a neighbor about this. Still on the topic of merchandise, there was a discussion of what we are offering; Susan recommended streamlining our inventory.

Don has noticed deer damage in the pollinator garden and will explore spray options.

It was voted (Dick/Jim) to approve \$217.19 for Brynna and the children's programs.
