Increase Your Professional Skills by Earning Continuing Education Units

Akamai University College of Continuing Education provides continuing education units (CEU) to assist professionals in upgrading their knowledge and competency. The training includes live or on-line seminars, classes, webinars, mentorship and supervision in which 1 CEU = 10 contact hours. Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What does international accreditation mean?

A: Akamai University underwent a lengthy application process that included submitting organizational information, evaluation, program materials, student thesis, dissertation and file reviews, meeting administration, faculty, staff, and student interviews nationally and internationally, including an a site visit at headquarters and two other locations. The evaluation included agreeing to adhere to the ASIC criteria. Akamai has been designated as an ASIC Premier University for demonstrating several quality areas of strength and good practice.

Q: What is the benefit of continuing education units (CEU's)?

A: Akamai University strives to provide a high level of accountability and credibility for its programs in all aspects of the university life and educational programs to support individuals to increase their professional skills and competency following through with a dedication to the betterment of the human and planetary health..

Q: What constitutes one CEU?

A: One CEU equals ten contact hours of participation in organized continuing education classes and/or training conducted by a qualified instructor either in person or on-line. A contact hour is equivalent to one 50 - 60-minute interaction between an instructor and the participant.

Q: What is the minimum period of contact for which a CEU can be awarded?

A: A CEU cannot be granted for learning events that are less than 50 to 60 minutes in length.

Q: Which offerings of professional development qualify for CEUs at Akamai University?

A: Participants can receive credit for most of our professional development programs with clear objectives to meet learner needs in which participant learning can be assessed. CEUs are not available for plenary sessions, exhibit hall presentations, meetings, social events, archived online events, or those sessions that provide participants with information about a particular "product" or program without including measurable learning objectives.

Q: What are the attendance requirements in order to receive CEU credit(s)?

A: Each participant will sign a check-in roster at the event and must attend the **entire** event. For face-to-face events, certificates are prepared in advance of the event but will **not** be distributed to participants until a completed conference evaluation form and (if applicable) a CEU certification card has been submitted to the instructor or CEU desk at the conclusion of the event. For online events, staff will review participant attendance via the online learning platform. Certificates are awarded after the confirmation of complete attendance and all requirements to meet the objectives.

Q: How will attendance be certified for large, multi-session events or conferences?

A: Each CEU-eligible session will have a faculty representative available at the session's conclusion to certify your attendance and compiling of any assigned work. At the conclusion of the entire event, you will submit your CEU certification card to the representative. Your attendance will be tabulated and a certificate will be mailed shortly after the event.

Q: Can I register for an event on-site?

A: Most registration will occur off site before the educational effort that is live. Certificates will either be distributed after the continuing education session or mailed out after the event.

Q: How are CEUs determined?

A: Each certificate offered by the College of Continuing Education will include the number of CEUs earned and the number of contact hours. (1 CEU = 10 contact hours). A historical record for each participant with contact details will be kept by the for a period of at least seven years.

Q: How does the Akamai University ensure the quality of workshop teachers, faculty and consultants? Does the instructor have any discretion in determining whether CEUs are awarded?

A: Yes. Akamai University regular or adjunct faculty / teachers / instructors/ consultants will be used, wherever appropriate, for workshops in which CEUs are awarded. When a professional development event would benefit most from a recognized expert in the field, the AU College of Coning Education reserves the right to invite guest consultants as presenters. An instructor who determines that a participant has not gained satisfactory knowledge from a particular professional development event may withhold the certificate and inform the Dean of the College of Continuing Education of that decision.
