Shortly after the tenth consecutive season of the Idyllwild International Festival of Cinema came to a close in California, IIFC founder and director Stephen Savage and executive producer Trinity Houston found themselves on a plane to London to film first act segments of Savage's newest film project "Ulysses Coyote". It was during that week of filming (in and around SoHo) that Savage received a message from his friend, Scottish born actress Mhairi Calvey, saying she would be in London for a day or so and wondered if they might get together for lunch. Savage, of course, dragged Houston along

between friends. Within the first 30 minutes of that lunch, Savage, Houston, and Calvey had gone from catching up and passing around pleasantries, to grabbing onto Savage's off handed remark that he'd like to follow up on Idyllwild's success with a film festival in the UK. Calvey put forth that her obvious Scottish connections might provide a fast track to getting the new event off the ground if it were to happen in the north, and before the final course, the basic framework

Festival of Cinema was laid out. Now, only a couple of years (and a slight hiccup known as Covid-19) later, we find ourselves in the picturesque village of Peebles, coming full circle from that lunch discussion to the inaugural season of the Scotland international Festival of Cinema (SIFC). Not to say that the organization and actual launch was without its speed bumps, it had its share without a doubt. But with the addition of two other Scottish born SIFC team leaders, actress and screenwriter Vivien Reid, who brought the village of Peebles and the beautiful Eastgate Theatre and Arts Centre to the table, and to what was supposed to be a casule get together screenwriter and producer Lesley Paterson, the

overall planning and execution of this bold move has gone surprisingly easy when viewed against other such ventures in this era of pandemics and lockdowns. 



Lesley Paterson




Casablanca: An 80th Anniversary Celebration




Music legend brings his genius to the SIFC Grand Jury
