- 1. Pasta sauce and spaghetti are the most commonly donated foods. Peanut Butter and jelly are right behind but are only useful if the participant can get bread.
- 2. Mac n Cheese mixes only work with milk and butter/margarine which are harder to find.
- 3. Canned food is good as long as the recipient has a can opener. Look for pull-tab lids.
- 4. Consider cooking oil olive oil is most appreciated.
- 5. Spices, spices and more spices they can be as simple as salt and pepper sets.

- 6. Tea bags and coffee are welcome.
- 7. Sugar and flour are treats.
- 8. Tuna (in pull-tab cans) and crackers make a good lunch.
- 9. Cake mixes and frosting cans help celebrate birthdays.
- 10. Dishwashing detergent is expensive but everyone deserves clean dishes.
- 11. Feminine hygiene products are most welcome.
