#### Easy Directions

- Pick a translation of the Bible which you like to read and find a copy that you can carry around with you
- Read the passage indicated for each day
- Sundays do not have a selection as that is a day of rest and worship
- Reflect on what was written
- Jot down any questions or thoughts
- If you miss a day, just pick it up on the next
- Enjoy the process and remember that just like trying to tie your shoes seven times on Monday for the week, so also reading a week's worth of the Bible in one day will not be as meaningful as taking a few minutes each day to spend with God!

#### Notes:

- The summer reading program once again follows the upcoming season of the Narrative Lectionary. Over a four-year cycle on the Sundays from September through May each year, the texts follow the sweep of the biblical story, from Creation through the early Christian church. The texts show the breadth and variety to be found within Scripture. They invite people to hear the stories of Abraham and Sarah, Moses and the prophets, Jesus, and Paul. Listening to the many different voices within Scripture enriches our life of faith.
- This is year 3 in the cycle, and it begins with the second account of creation, the fall, along with accounts of Abraham, Jacob, and Joseph. Among the remaining OT passages, we also visit Samuel, David, Elijah, Jonah, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Daniel (in the lion's den), and Joel.
- The gospel for this year's cycle is Luke, and following the Resurrection, the lectionary then takes us into a few of the big issues in the early church in Acts and finishes with Paul's letter to the Galatians.
- We then fill in the remainder of the program with a few wonderful Psalms. Enjoy!
