PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE, SPRING 2018

At our annual business meeting last November in Chicago, members of the Society and the Executive Council proposed a number of projects for the Society to focus on during the year ahead, and in a subsequent poll of the Executive Council we settled on the following five top priorities for 2018:

- 1. Make improvements to our journal, *Slovene Studies*, designed to enhance its utility and attractiveness, both to prospective contributors of articles and to our general readership;
- 2. Upgrade the Society's web page to be in conformity with current design and accessibility standards;
- 3. Establish criteria and an application process for awarding travel stipends to graduate students and other junior members of the Society whose Slovene studies-related research has been accepted for presentation at a major regional, national or international conference;
- 4. Expand and diversify the Society's newsletter; and
- 5. Conduct a membership drive based on a census of current and recent undergraduate and graduate students studying Slovene at

North American colleges, as well as of Slovene post-doctoral researchers and other professionals employed at universities and in private industry here.

We on the Board want to extend thanks to our colleague Dr. Oto Luthar, Director of the Scientific Research Institute of the Slovene Academy of Sciences and Arts (ZRC SAZU), for providing both impetus and encouragement to enhance our journal, and to Mr. Aleš Pogačnik, editor-in-chief of ZRC Publishers in Ljubljana, for invaluable advice on implementation. By the time of our next annual meeting this November in Boston we plan to report on progress in each of these five areas.

For background on each of these planned initiatives, I recommend reading the minutes of our November 2017 business meeting, ably and extensively captured by our secretary, Kristina Reardon, and reproduced as the last item of this issue of the newsletter.

CELEBRATING THE 45TH ANNIVERSARY

The Society will begin celebrating its forty-fifth anniversary this year on March 24 at Ohio State (OSU). University The Midwest Conference keynote address will be delivered by the SSS President Michael Biggins, on behalf of the OSU Slovene Research Initiative and the Society for Slovene Studies. The talk, titled Canons Continually Recast: Claiming Space for the Genius of Europe's Borderlands, will draw on examples from Slovenian literature and art to demonstrate the unrealized international potential of creative traditions that accidents of geography and language have obscured from wider appreciation and to argue that Slovenists and, by extension, East Europeanists have decades' worth of vital cultural recovery work yet to accomplish.

The ASEEES 50th annual convention will take place in Boston, MA: 6-9 DEC 2018. The schedule of meetings, of Slovene-themed panels as well as select Yugoslav- and Habsburg-themed panels of interest will be published in the Fall.

FRANK J. BARTOL, Educator, Historian, and Raconteur, 1929–2015, by Mary Turvey

On November 28, 2015 in the little settlement of Traunik, Michigan, located about 30 miles south of Marquette, the usually quiet old Slovenian community was filled with descendants of its early settlers, teachers, historians, students, friends and beloved family members who came to say farewell to Frank Bartol, a life long resident of Traunik. The setting was the Traunik Slovenian Hall which was built first as an Slovene National Benefit Society meeting place back in 1922, and in 1993 purchased to become a local meeting place for Slovenians of the region. Frank was at home in this hall, set on the land he loved. Choosing a "farewell" in accordance with early Slovenian immigrants, the funeral reception setting was of Frank resting in a cedar wooden casket he made...
