Treasurer's Report:

Master Financial Statement 2022/2023

- We now have our adopted budget and forecasted budget for 2024
- Annual plan of work is submitted to county, we will be receiving close to \$8,000

Guests:

Eagle River Community Water Plan Draft:

- 7 year process

- Meant to provide an analysis of past, present, and future use analysis
 - Prevent increasing challenges, mitigate issues, correct historical degradation
 - Will provide decision making tools for ERC and county partners
 - ERC hopes that this will guide local policy and direct funding to local entities
- Covers the ERW, but not entire river system (does not include homestake creek, front range water issues kept this piece out)
 - Hopes include more of the watershed in future iterations
- Based on the same modeling platform that the Colorado River District uses, along with historical water quality data collected by ERC and ERWSD.
- Goes to ERC board on 3/14 for first approval
- After approval, it will be distributed to partners for editing, adoption
 - Not content feedback, but clarification feedback
- ERC is starting several projects to address issues brought forward by the water plan, that there is current funding for
- ECCD recommends changing the language covering agriculture to:
 - Pg. 57:
 - Remove the use of "open space" to describe agricultural lands.
 - Integrate the benefits of agriculture to soil health and thus infiltration and water quality
 - Connect the importance of infrastructure improvements with water efficiency, to create funding opportunities for senior water rights holders
 - Provide a connection of wildlife habitat use with agricultural lands
 - Look into Brush Creek specifically as to the historical cause of degradation, as currently it is attributed to agriculture in the report but it is likely caused by Eagle County water tank.
- The plan will be updated every 5 years, and ECCD will be a part of future revisions and discussions in smaller group settings rather than a large stakeholder meeting.

 - Retta Bruegger (CSU) presented the initial analysis of the feedback data at CSSRM
 - Major themes
 - 24% of feedback themes address challenges and issues with the technology - overwhelming majority
 - 10% of the feedback themes addressed benefits
