

The long-term goal of Civil Society Field Hearings is to build participation models that generate a flow of sustained discourse between elected leaders and the people.

Members have different roles. In 2004, Congressman Lee Hamilton (IN, ret.) outlined the roles of a Member of Congress. This information is provided to help you align your topic with the duties of a representative. A Member of Congress has the following roles:

- National legislators are working to pass the laws of our nation and determine spending levels for thousands of federal programs;
- Local representatives are serving the priorities, interests, and economic needs of their constituents;
- Constituent advocate for individual groups, industries, and communities in the district;
- Committee member, which requires developing specific expertise
- Investigator charged with oversight of the federal government;
- Educator who can translate the work of Congress for constituents as well as the media;
- Student of their constituents;
- Local dignitaries and ambassadors
- Fundraiser to run for re-election;
- Staff manager
- Party leader in the party's caucus
- Consensus builder both within and between parties

This Civil Society Field Hearing is an opportunity to create a space where your members can be present as part of the local community. The invitation letter below requests the member's presence to offer comments after the panel of witnesses. However, you can change this role based on the member's input and preference. If the member cannot attend, request that a district staffer attend instead.
