

WELCOME to IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH

We wish to extend a warm welcome to all our visitors here today. It is our hope that you will benefit by your worship here with us, and that you will return again soon. We would greatly appreciate it if everyone would fill out an Attendance/Communion card so that we can keep track of our attendance. They are located in the pew racks in front of you.

AS WE GATHER One of the charming traditions of days gone by, still observed by some families, is the designation of a Christmas room in the house. In older homes, that room often was a parlor or dining room. The Christmas room was closed off to the family by the parents for days or even weeks before Christmas Eve and was beautified by a parent, grandparent, or other designated adult with decorations and greens and, most centrally, a Christmas tree, which frequently had heirloom ornaments on it. The room was set aside to remind all in the house to make room in their lives for the coming of Jesus, the Christ Child. In his wellloved paraphrase of Psalm 98, Isaac Watts writes: "Joy to the world, the Lord is come! Let earth receive her King; Let ev'ry heart prepare Him room" (LSB 387:1). Tonight, the room in our hearts is filled with the joyful assurance that Christ has come to fill the world and our lives with His love.


RINGING OF THE BELL


LIGHTING OF THE CHRISTMAS CANDLE (Psalm 24:1, 3–5 John 8:12)

HYMN INTRODUCTION

P The joy of Christmas echoes through the songs and carols of Christmas. Some of the most beloved songs of Christmas were learned in childhood and remain a source of joy and delight throughout our lives. A song associated with Christmas but sung in many churches throughout the year is "God Loves Me Dearly." Written in Germany in 1852 by a Lutheran pastor, this song was included in a collection of Christian songs for young people. Soon

after it was first sung in German Lutheran settings, it made the journey across the Atlantic Ocean with those immigrating to America, where it became well loved by the Lutheran people settling in the United States. Translated into English by the early twentieth century, this expression of God's love for us has found a welcome place in the hymnody of our congregations.

[During the following hymn, the pastor takes the light from the Christ candle to the ushers. They pass the light on to the congregation.)




