PSALM Psalm 51

- P Have mercy upon me, O God, according to Your lovingkindness; according to the multitude of Your tender mercies, blot out my transgressions.
- C Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.
- P For I acknowledge my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.
- C Against You, You only, have I sinned, and done this evil in Your sight—that You may be found just when You speak, and blameless when You judge.

- P Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin my mother conceived me.
- C Behold, You desire truth in the inward parts, and in the hidden part You will make me to know wisdom.
- P Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.
- C Make me hear joy and gladness, that the bones You have broken may rejoice.
- P Hide Your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.
- C Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.
- P Do not cast me away from Your presence, and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me.
- C Restore to me the joy of Your salvation, and uphold me by Your generous Spirit.
- P Then I will teach transgressors Your ways, and sinners shall be converted to You.
- C Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, the God of my salvation, and my tongue shall sing aloud of Your righteousness.
- P O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth shall show forth Your praise.
- C For You do not desire sacrifice, or else I would give it; You do not delight in burnt offering.
- P The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broken and a contrite heart—these, O God, You will not despise.
- C Do good in Your good pleasure to Zion; build the walls of Jerusalem.
- P Then You shall be pleased with the sacrifices of righteousness, with burnt offering and whole burnt offering; then they shall offer bulls on Your altar.

FIRST READING Romans 10:6-13

6 But the righteousness of faith speaks in this way, "Do not say in your

heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?' " (that is, to bring Christ down from above) 7 or, " 'Who will descend into the abyss?' " (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). 8 But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): 9 that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. 11 For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame." 12 For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for the same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him. 13 For "whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

SECOND READING *Luke 22:66-23:12*

66 As soon as it was day, the elders of the people, both chief priests and scribes, came together and led Him into their council, saying, 67 "If You are the Christ, tell us."

But He said to them, "If I tell you, you will by no means believe. 68 And if I also ask you, you will by no means answer Me or let Me go. 69 Hereafter the Son of Man will sit on the right hand of the power of God."

70 Then they all said, "Are You then the Son of God?"

So He said to them, "You rightly say that I am."

- 71 And they said, "What further testimony do we need? For we have heard it ourselves from His own mouth."
- 1 Then the whole multitude of them arose and led Him to Pilate.
- 2 And they began to accuse Him, saying, "We found this fellow perverting the nation, and forbidding to pay taxes to Caesar, saying that He Himself is Christ, a King."
- 3 Then Pilate asked Him, saying, "Are You the King of the Jews?"

He answered him and said, "It is as you say."

4 So Pilate said to the chief priests and the crowd, "I find no fault in this Man."


5 But they were the more fierce, saying, "He stirs up the people, teaching throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee to this place."

6 When Pilate heard of Galilee, he asked if the Man were a Galilean.

7 And as soon as he knew that He belonged to Herod's jurisdiction, he sent Him to Herod, who was also in Jerusalem at that time. 8 Now when Herod saw Jesus, he was exceedingly glad, for he had desired for a long time to see Him, because he had heard many things about Him, and he hoped to see some miracle done by Him. 9 Then he questioned Him with many words, but He answered him nothing. 10 And the chief priests and scribes stood and vehemently accused Him. 11 Then Herod, with his men of war, treated Him with contempt and mocked Him, arrayed Him in a gorgeous robe, and sent Him back to Pilate. 12 That very day Pilate and Herod became friends with each other, for previously they had been at enmity with each other.




COLLECT FOR PEACE


