
The lighting of the third Advent candle on the Advent wreath occurs during the singing of the hymn.

FIRST READING *Isaiah 61:1–4, 10–11*

- 1 "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon Me, because the Lord has anointed Me to preach good tidings to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound;
- 2 To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn,
- 3 To console those who mourn in Zion, to give them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; that they may be called trees of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified."
- 4 And they shall rebuild the old ruins, they shall raise up the former desolations, and they shall repair the ruined cities, the desolations of many generations.
- 10 I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, My soul shall be joyful in my God; for He has clothed me with the garments of salvation, He has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with ornaments, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.
- 11 For as the earth brings forth its bud, as the garden causes the things that are sown in it to spring forth, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring forth before all the nations.

SECOND READING

Luke 1:39-56

39 Now Mary arose in those days and went into the hill country with haste, to a city of Judah, 40 and entered the house of Zacharias and greeted Elizabeth. 41 And it happened, when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, that the babe leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. 42 Then she spoke out with a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! 43 But why is this granted to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? 44 For indeed, as soon as the voice of your greeting sounded in my ears, the babe leaped in my womb for joy. 45 Blessed is she who believed, for there will be a fulfillment of those things which were told her from the Lord."

- 46 And Mary said:
 - "My soul magnifies the Lord,
- 47 And my spirit has rejoiced in God my Savior.
- 48 For He has regarded the lowly state of His maidservant; for behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed.
- 49 For He who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is His name.
- And His mercy is on those who fear Him from generation to generation.
- He has shown strength with His arm; He has scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts.
- He has put down the mighty from their thrones, and exalted the lowly.
- He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich He has sent away empty.
- He has helped His servant Israel, in remembrance of His mercy,
- 55 As He spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his seed forever."
- 56 And Mary remained with her about three months, and returned to her house.

THIRD READING Revelation 5:6-14

6 And I looked, and behold, in the midst of the throne and of the four living creatures, and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as though it had been slain, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God sent out into all the earth. 7 Then He came and took the scroll out of the right hand of Him who sat on the throne. 8 Now when He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each having a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. 9 And they sang a new song, saying:

"You are worthy to take the scroll, and to open its seals; for You were slain, and have redeemed us to God by Your Blood out of every tribe and tongue and people and nation,


- 10 And have made us kings and priests to our God; and we shall reign on the earth."


LUTHER'S EVENING PRAYER
