

WELCOME to IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH

We wish to extend a warm welcome to all our visitors this evening. It is our hope that you will benefit by your worship here with us, and that you will return again soon. We would greatly appreciate it if everyone would fill out an Attendance/Communion card so that we can keep track of our attendance. - A Prayer Upon Entering Church O Lord, as I celebrate this Sacrament, I remember Your entire life of service and especially Your death, by which I am given life. Grant that I may proclaim Your death as often as I eat this bread and drink this cup; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- **AS WE GATHER** Over the centuries, God dealt with His people through covenants. Noah, Moses, and David all received covenants, each full of grace and blessing. One covenant, though, was still only a promise until the coming of Christ: The new covenant prophesied through Jeremiah, when everyone would know God as the One who had forgiven their sins. The writer of Hebrews remembers the promise and sees it fulfilled in our Lord's death, eliminating the need for further sacrifices. On the night in which He was betrayed, Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, and He said the cup is "the new covenant in My blood." We celebrate the blessings that come to us in the Sacrament: forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation.

INTRODUCTION

On the night in which He was betrayed, Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper. He commanded Р us to remember Him when we celebrate the Sacrament. Indeed, through it He causes His death to be remembered so that we may have life. But we ask Him to remember us as well! We pray that He would not remember our sins and iniquities, but in mercy and grace to grant us forgiveness, life, and salvation.

OPENING SENTENCES

Luke 22:19-20; Hebrews 10:17-18, 22; Psalm 25:6-7

- Lest we forget. Iesus commanded. P
- C "Do this in remembrance of Me."
- P For, He explained,
- C "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood."
- The new covenant is the fulfillment of the promise made centuries earlier through P Ieremiah. It is recalled in the Epistle:
- C "I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more. Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin."
- P Therefore, the writer exhorts us,
- C "let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith."
- P As we approach the Table of the Lord in faithful obedience, we are asking Him to 2

- remember us as well! It is the age-old plea David expressed in the Psalms:
- C Remember Your mercy, O LORD, and Your steadfast love, for they have been from of old. Remember not the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to Your steadfast love remember me, for the sake of Your goodness, O LORD!
- P Let us now draw near to our gracious God to confess our sins, assured that for the sake of Jesus' sacrificial death, forgiveness is freely available.

Silence for reflection on the Word of God and our sinful condition.

INVOCATION

- P In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
- C But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

(We take a moment of silence to reflect on our sin and our need for the Savior.)

- P Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.
- C Most merciful God, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve Your present and eternal punishment. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.
- P Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. (John 20:19-23)
- C Amen.

Grant that we may so receive the sacred mystery of Your body and blood that the fruits of Your redemption may continually be manifest in us; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
- C Amen

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Jeremiah 31:31–34*

(The Lord promises a new covenant.)

31 "Behold, the days are coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah— 32 not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day that I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt, My covenant which they broke, though I was a husband to them, says the Lord. 33 But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put My law in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people. 34 No more shall every man teach his neighbor, and every man his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they all shall know Me, from the least of them to the greatest of them, says the Lord. For I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin I will remember no more."

P This is the Word of the Lord.

C Thanks be to God.

GRADUAL Hebrews 9:12a, c, 15a; Psalm 111:9a

- P Christ entered once for all into the holy places, by means of His own blood,
- C thus securing an eternal redemption.
- P Therefore He is the mediator of a new covenant,
- C so that those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.
- P He sent redemption to His people;
- C He has commanded His covenant forever.

EPISTLE Hebrews 10:15–25

(We may approach God, confident of forgiveness for Jesus' sake.)

15 But the Holy Spirit also witnesses to us; for after He had said before, 16 "This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put My laws into their hearts, and in their minds I will write them," 17 then He adds, "Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more." 18 Now where there is remission of these, there is no longer an offering for sin. 19 Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus, 20 by a new and living way which He consecrated for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh, 21 and having a High Priest over the house of God, 22 let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. 23 Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, 25 not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day

approaching.

- C Thanks be to God.

HOLY GOSPEL

Luke 22:7-20

(Jesus institutes the Lord's Supper.)

P The Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-second chapter.

C Glory to You, O Lord.

7 Then came the Day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover must be killed. 8 And He sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat." 9 So they said to Him, "Where do You want us to prepare?" 10 And He said to them, "Behold, when you have entered the city, a man will meet you carrying a pitcher of water; follow him into the house which he enters. 11 Then you shall say to the master of the house, "The Teacher says to you, "Where is the guest room where I may eat the Passover with My disciples?" ' 12 Then he will show you a large, furnished upper room; there make ready." 13 So they went and found it just as He had said to them, and they prepared the Passover. 14 When the hour had come, He sat down, and the twelve apostles with Him. 15 Then He said to them, "With fervent desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; 16 for I say to you, I will no longer eat of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." 17 Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, "Take this and divide it among yourselves; 18 for I say to you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes." 19 And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me." 20 Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you.

NICENE CREED


