



# Installation of the Pastor-elect

# (The Officiating Minister says to the pastor-elect)

Pastor: Dear Brother: Whereas you have been called as Pastor of this Congregation, and are assuming charge of the flock of Christ in this place, it is fitting that you should bear in mind the solemn duties of this sacred office, that you may fulfil them is such manner as behooves a devout and zealous minister of the church.

> As an ambassador for Christ, you are to preach and teach the pure doctrine of the divine Word, to administer the holy Sacraments according to the institution and ordinance of Christ, to instruct the young in the way of salvation, to counsel the inquiring, to strengthen the weak, to seek the lost, and reclaim the erring, to comfort the sorrowing, to care for the needy, to visit the sick, to minister to the dying, and ever to have at heart, and pray for, the spiritual welfare of every soul under your care.

> You are to give yourself to the meditation and study of the Scriptures, to administer your office conforming to the Word of God, and show yourself and your household a pattern to others in piety and godliness, giving no offense in anything, that the ministry be not be blamed.

Hear what St. Paul says:

This is a faithful saying: If a man desires the position of a bishop, he desires a good work. 2 A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, temperate, sober-minded, of good behavior, hospitable, able to teach; 3 not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money, but gentle, not quarrelsome, not covetous; 4 one who rules his own house well, having his children in submission with all reverence 5 (for if a man does not know how to rule his own house, how will he take care of the church of God?); 6 not a novice, lest being puffed up with pride he fall into the same condemnation as the devil. 7 Moreover he must have a good testimony among those who are outside, lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil. (1 Timothy 3:1-7)

2 Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching. 5 But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry. (2 Timothy 4:2,5)

Be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity. 13 Till I come, give attention to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine. 14 Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you by prophecy with the laying on of the hands of the eldership. 15 Meditate on these things; give yourself entirely to them, that your progress may be evident to all. 16 Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you. (1 Timothy 4:12-16)

Pastor: I ask you, Dear Brother, in the presence of God and this Congregation:

Are you will and ready to take upon you the charge of this Congregation, and to perform faithfully all the duties of your ministry? Answer: I am.

Will you preach and teach the pure Word of God in accordance with the Confessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church and adorn the doctrine of our Savior by a godly and holy life?

Answer: Yes, with the help of God.

Will you faithfully instruct both young and old in the chief articles of Christian doctrine, will you forgive the sins of those who repent, and retain the sins of those who do not repent, will you promise never to divulge the sins confessed to you? Will you minister faithfully to the sick and dying, and will you demonstrate to the Church a constant and ready ministry centered in the Gospel? Will you admonish and encourage the people to a lively confidence in Christ and in Holy living? **Answer: Yes, with the help of God.** 

(The Officiating Minister says to the Congregation)

Pastor: Dearly Beloved: You have heard the solemn promise given by him whom you have called to be your pastor. I admonish and charge you to receive him in this office, and be ever mindful of what the Word of God demands of you as members of his flock.

Attend with all diligence the preaching of the Word, receiving it, not as the word of man, but, as it is in truth, the Word of God.

Heed his admonition, receiving with meekness the Word, which is able to save your souls.

Aid him by your influence in instructing the young, remembering the exhortation to bring up your children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

Honor and love him, as St. Paul says in 1 *Thessalonians 5:12,13: "Recognize those who labor among you, and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake.* 

Pray for him without ceasing, that in his labors and anxieties he may retain a cheerful spirit, and his ministry among you may be blessed.

Provide also for his temporal wants; for the Lord says: "The laborer is worthy of his wages." (Luke 10:7); and St. Paul says: "Let him who is taught the word share in all good things with him who teaches." (Galatians 6:6)

Finally remember the words of the Apostle:

"Obey those who rule over you, and be submissive, for they watch out for your souls, as those who must give account. Let them do so with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you." (Hebrews 13:17)

I now ask you:

Are you willing to receive your Pastor as a minister of God, and to show towards him such love, honor , and fit obedience in the Lord as are due to an overseer and guide placed over you by the Lord Jesus Christ, the Chief Shepherd and Bishop of souls? Then answer, "We are". **Answer: We are.** 

Will you support him by your gifts and pray for him always that in his labors he may retain a cheerful spirit and that his ministry among you may be abundantly blessed? Then answer, "We will with the help of God." **Answer: We will with the help of God.**  Will you honor and uphold your Pastor as he serves Christ in all his Godpleasing responsibilities? Will you aid him as he cares for his family? Will you be diligent to "put the best construction on everything," recognizing that "love covers a multitude of sins"? If so, then answer, "We will with the help of God."


