Mark 14:32-41a & John 13:23-25 John Reclining/Sleeping Apr.17, 2025 Holy Thursday @ Immanuel, Mercedes

INTRO: The conversation & events in tonight's Gospel reading occurred in the Upper Room at out Lord's Last Supper. We had a Wed. night sermon about Judas. Tonight we will study an unnamed disciple mentioned in John 13:23-25. (read it)

## I. THE SIGNIFICANCE OF JOHN'S RECLINING

- A. His (mutual, special) love for/from Jesus
  - 1. Upper Room scene; reclining close to Jesus' breast
  - 2. shared cushions at 'coffee table'
  - 3. John 13:23 'disciple whom Jesus loved (Upper Room)
  - 4. John 19:26 at Calvary, Jesus' mother and the 'disciple...loved')
  - 5. a special friendship, closeness (agapay both times)(youngest?)
- B. The beloved disciple's biography
  - 1. personal call to faith, to discipleship
  - 2. with Peter & brother James Zebedee; an intimate circle of 3
  - 3. Peter's mother-in-law; Transfiguration; Gethsemane
  - 4. lived to old age; Ephesus, Patmos; Revelations
- 5. beloved disciple; responsible apostle
- C. His reception of the Last Supper
  - 1. at Last Supper, others asked John to ask Jesus
  - 2. John was closest in proximity and affinity
  - 3, John's gospel spends six chapters in Upper Room!
  - 4. possibly first one in the world to receive Holy Communion
  - 5. beloved disciple attentive, involved, remembering...
- 6. and no more than an hour later... (read Mark 14:32-41a)

# II. THE STORY OF JOHN'S SLEEPING IN GETHSEMANE

## A. Such a contrast

- 1. agony beginning for Jesus; Passion intensifies
- 2. Jesus must bear the world's sins alone
- 3. He strengthens Himself with an hour of prayer
- 4. requests prayers and presence of His close friends
- 5. possible excuses: late hour; big meal; wine; sorrow (Luke)
- 6. Jesus still chides them for not staying awake
- B. The harm to John
  - 1. Jesus earlier said all would fall away, watch and pray
- 2. here again warned, lest they fall into temptation
- 3. later guilt for failing a friend's final request
- 4. could have missed the meaning of Jesus' passion
- 5. disciples tempted to guilt, despair, disbelief

#### C. The hurt to Jesus

- 1. sinless True Man; had human feelings!
- 2. no human friend awake; only an angel strengthened Him
- 3. hear the hurt: could ye not watch with me one hour
- 4. heightened alone-ness before the cross; disappointing
- 5. every sin grieves Jesus; the Father; Holy Spirit
- 6. especially those sins from close friends of Jesus

#### III. THE WAYS IN WHICH WE ARE LIKE JOHN

## A. A called disciple

- 1. called 'little Christ' in baptism
- 2. invited to same feast of His Body and Blood
- 3. we have His promised presence with us, also
  - a. personally: Lo, I am with you always, even...
  - b. corporately: Where 2 or 3 are gathered together in My name
- c. sacramentaly: My Body/Blood for you...remission of your...
- 4. created anew in Christ Jesus into good works; like praying

#### B. Burdened with sinful flesh

- 1. our excuses, like John, for not watching one hour
- a. church is too warm, too drafty, too cold, too noisy
- b. too busy for worship, devotion, study, meditation
- c. worst: I don't need an hour with Jesus
- 2. spirit is willing, flesh is weak (Matt.26:4;1)
- 3. Paul: a war among my members (Rom7:18ff)
- 4. spirit/flesh in spiritual, ethical sense; not body per se
- 5. while still in 'the flesh' we need to watch and pray

## C. Needing Jesus' repeated reminders

- 1. still needing Holy Word with reminders
- 2. prayer before, during, and after temptations
- 3. thoroughly immersed in Word as defense against temptation
- 4. as we fall (and we will) heeding calls to repentance
- 5. watching what Jesus has done for us, vicariously
- 6. Jesus' suffering was paying for His friends' sins of not adequately watching and praying
- 7. so, John is forgiven! you and I are forgiven!

CONCLUSION: I thank you who have stayed awake this past hour, and I thank God for you, my friends; Jesus' friends.
