INTRO: Tempus fugit (Lat.) = time flies. Discussion w/Prof. Jeff Gibbs WRT time and eternity. Began w/evening and morning of

Gen.1. A measurable commodity. Let's think about how we use our allotted time among one another (brethren) People speak of their 'walk of life'; mine is a dead run!

I. BE WISE WHILE REDEEMING THE TIME

- A. Watch your 'walking around' as children of light (v.8)
 - 1. i.e., the way you live your life
 - 2. God is watching, of course
 - 3. Paul wrote to those 'dead in trespasses...made alive' (Eph.2:1)
 - 4. saved by grace (2:8) created in Christ Jesus unto good works (2:10)
 - 5. and so also are we
- B. Not as fools, but redeeming the time (v.15)
 - 1. Greek = 'unwise' ergo, foolish
 - 2. reminds of "Thou fool! This night..." (Luke 12:20)
 - 3. redeem (Greek) = buying back the time; ransoming
 - 4. probably = "make the most of your time"
 - 5. it is limited, you know, so use it wisely; be ready...
- C. Understanding the will of the Lord (v.17) = wise
 - 1. (Prov.9:10) fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom
 - 2. contra fool who says in his heart "There is no God" (Ps.14:1)
 - 3. truly known **only** through His revealed Word
 - 4. and knowing self as unwise, abuser of 'time'
 - 5. yet recipient of grace of God in Christ (2:8-9)
 - 6. the will of God also is your sanctification (2:10)

II. BEWARE, WHILE REDEEMING THE TIME*

- A. (Beware) of Evil Days (v.16
 - 1. oldsters remember Fibber McGee, Jack Benny, Beaver Cleaver
 - 2. unlike these times: Bart Simpson, Beavis and Butthead
 - 3. a world which calls infanticide and sodomy to be 'rights'
 - 4. tempting us to idolatrous individualism (me first) and materialism (my stuff)
 - 5. if only Paul could have seen our 'evil days'

(continued)

- B. (Beware) of addictions
 - 1. too easy to say "Aha, I'm not drunk with wine" (v.18)
- 2. Paul's shorthand for all addictions: chemical, nicotine, gambling; video games; internet; gluttony...
- 3. anything which replaces God in our conscious minds
- 4. worse, most addictions progress
- 5. but the worst sin is its obsession, compulsion over us
- C. (Beware) of poor stewardship of time
 - 1. 'redeeming the time' could mean 'making best use of time'
 - 2. created by God; given to us in unknown, finite measure
 - 3. time, too, belonging to Him as Lord, us as stewards
 - 4. Who, in a sense, 'redeemed' and sanctified also our time
 - 5. entering fullness of time at Nativity; using His time to redeem entire world from sin; successfully finishing His time
 - 6. calling us by faith from time to eternity on our last day

III. BE FILLED WHILE REDEEMING THE TIME

- A. With the (Holy) Spirit (v.18)
 - 1. i.e., 3rd Person of Trinity; as we confess in creeds
 - 2. whom you already have since your baptism (Acts 2:38-39)
 - 3. 'when and where He pleases' like the wind (John 3)
 - 4. promised to us via means of word and sacrament
 - 5. ironic, not drunk with wine, which is vehicle of the Holy Spirit!
- B. Singing (v.19)
 - 1. 'speaking to one another' not a personal possession of yours alone
 - 2. psalms, hymns, songs should say something, not just 'feel good'
 - 3. a message with a mood: penitential and also joyful
 - 4. a message which will gladden your heart, if Cristocentric
 - 5. why, one can even 'think-sing'
- C. With thanksgiving
 - 1. which confesses Someone Else as the Giver
 - 2. Who gave all, even His only-begotten Son
 - 3. so we may 'walk the walk' and be forgiven when stumbling
 - 4. the gift of the Spirit enables our walk

CONCLUSION: Today is our kickoff for another church year. Make the most of the days ahead and be filled with the Spirit.
