PROGRAM HISTORY



- 1979 The Urban Angler Program serving primarily urban youth in Worcester and Boston
- 1984 Wallop Breaux Amendment to the Federal Aid In Sportfish Restoration Program resulted in the Angler Education Program
- Teaching people to fish was the main focus, with water conservation, habitat protection, watersheds and wetlands, and outdoor ethics are also taught
- Primarily fishing classes and weekend family fishing festivals


Program goals

Family Fishing Festival Overview

- Weekend events
- 4 to 6 hours
- Open to the Public
- Partner with state agencies, businesses, and civic organizations
- Focus on Families
- Non-competitive
- Learning stations (casting/knot tying/fish I.D./equipment/etc...)
- Average 15 to 20 events annually with ~ 2,500 people attending

Family Fishing Clinics



- ➤ 2 to 3-hour programs designed to give participants a solid introduction to fishing
- > Typically, weekday evenings



Fishing Clinic Overview

- 2 to 3-hour programs
- Pre-Registration Required
- Focus on smaller groups
- Short talk on: equipment, safety and ethics, fish
 I.D. & anatomy, and rigging up
- Casting Practice
- Bulk of time is spent fishing
- Provide instructional handouts
- Average 75 to 100 clinics annually, with 1,500 to 2,000 people/year attending


