



"In everything give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus."



It was a warm spring day, Andy and Jon were visiting their grandmother who lived on the river.






In just a little while Andy caught several fish and they were in the basket at the edge of the water.

Because he had ADD, he never left the hook in the water long enough to catch a fish.




On this day, he had just put his hook in the water, when to his delight, he discovered he had caught a fish.
