Horn reform: In Cambodia, if you install a musical horn in your vehicle, you will be in trouble. The prime minister has ordered police across the country to enforce an order that car owners replace musical horns with normal horns. The leader had seen videos on social media of "inappropriate activity" associated with the musical horns, such as people, especially children and youth, dancing on the roads and roadsides as passing vehicles play tunes, creating a serious safety hazard. He has mandated that any musical horn should be ripped out and replaced with the standard honking kind. While this new law may take away some music from the streets, it aims to significantly improve road safety.

Baked Salmon Fillets Dijon

Ingredients

- 4 (4 ounce) fillets salmon 3 tbsp. - prepared Dijon-style mustard
- salt and pepper to taste 1/4 cup - Italian-style dry bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup butter, melted

RECIPE PREPARATION

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C)
- 2. Line a shallow baking pan with aluminum foil.
- 3. Place salmon skin-side down on foil. Spread a thin layer of mustard on the top of each fillet, and season with salt and pepper.
- 4. Top with bread crumbs, then drizzle with melted
- 5. Bake in a preheated oven for 15 minutes, or until salmon flakes easily with a fork
