





MISSOULA IS RICH WITH MANY DIFFERENT FORMS OF ART. PEOPLE COME FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE TO SHARE artistic expression. We have been dancing, teaching, and hosting events together for over 12 years. Our own unique experiences brought us to tango.

(Patrick) I never thought of myself as a dancer. Sure, I liked to get out and shake it up when listening to live music, but I never learned any steps or went to any dances. Thankfully, at a friend's suggestion I tried tango and got hooked! In retrospect, it makes sense, I like music. Now, when I listen to music I enjoy, I have this awesome instrument to play – my body!

(Lori) I have always danced; as a child spinning in the yard; grooving in the basement as a teen; dancing at university parties and to favorite bands. As a trained dancer I hung from ladders, danced in rainstorms; and even dashed across the Broadway stage. It has been a lifetime of movement and my greatest joy of all is moving with other people to music.

In tango we find a way to enjoy something we both value – to move to music with others. Each step is improvised in the moment – asking us to be totally present and listen fully to the music and our dance partner. Taking classes and participating in regular activities, we get to know others. We share conversation, food and other interests with our tango friends – people from their early teens up into their eighties.

This social connection brings a sense of belonging, safety and creativity. People are switching traditional roles and are free to dance with any gender. Our diversity comes together: the experienced dancer with the person tasting tango for the first time; dancers who have danced together so long they know that Biagi (an argentine orchestra leader) puts a flourish at the end of the next phrase so that together they add a timely adornment in their steps; a couple new to tango focusing and listening to each other as they do their first ocho (a fun twisty step). Off the dance floor, we spontaneously dance at live music, standing on a mountain top, in a friend's kitchen, in airport terminals waiting for a flight, or in an empty office on a work break. This spontaneous movement brings joy into our lives.

(Lori) In my 20's I could not imagine someone dancing in her 60's (I thought 50 was ancient.) Now here I am in my 60's dancing tango with vigor and joy. I have tangoed with my sweetheart, dear friends, tango professionals, and novices. I dance with my grocery cart, my refrigerator and cat – all with the great joy of being in the moment and moving to the music!

So if you're reading this and haven't thought of yourself as a dancer, reconsider. Do you like music? Do you like to be active and connect with others? In Missoula there are many options to choose from including; African dance, contact Improvisation, swing, contra dancing, salsa, tango, as well as the expressive arts like modern dance and ballet. You can let go of the isolation of the digital world, find direct connection with others and be part of a diverse, healthy community. Let's Dance!

HOW TO APPRECIATE - NOT APPROPRIATE -INDIGENOUS ART & FASHION

STUNNING COLOR SCHEMES AND INTRICATE PATTERNS MAKE INDIGENOUS FASHION, ART, AND JEWELRY appealing to people from all cultures. Unfortunately, many tribal designs and aesthetics are often appropriated by non-Indigenous people and brands for profit. As more people learn about issues like





cultural appropriation and the harm it causes to Indigenous people there is more hesitancy to buy these items.

At Indigenous Made Missoula, we often hear questions like, "Can a non-Native person wear beaded earrings?" The answer is an enthusiastic YES! Purchasing Indigenous made items shows support and reverence for Indigenous people. It's okay, and even encouraged, to purchase Indigenous products

even if it's not your heritage as long as you follow these important guidelines:

- Purchase your Indigenous art, fashion, and products from Indigenous people.
- When you wear Indigenous fashion and jewelry chances are someone will compliment you on the item. This is an opportunity for you to support the maker by sharing information about the artist.
- Do not purchase from or support non-Indigenous people or brands with products labeled as "Native-inspired," "Tribal," "Southwest," etc. This is cultural appropriation. It takes business away from actual Indigenous people by stealing an important part of our cultural heritage and often promoting harmful stereotypes and tropes.
- If you like a pattern or design, support the artist by purchasing the product or sharing a compliment. If you share photos on social media, always give credit to the artist.
- When in doubt ask! If you aren't sure if an item is appropriate for you to purchase or wear, ask the artist. They will be happy to tell you more about the piece.

The First Peoples' Market by Indigenous Made Missoula is the perfect place to find genuine Indigenous products and meet the artists and entrepreneurs behind each work of art. Items that have exclusive cultural significance or are considered sacred are not sold at the First Peoples' Market. Our vendors sell items that are appropriate for anyone of any culture to purchase, display, and wear. Shop local and support Indigenous artists during Missoula on Main from 12pm - 5pm at the Mercantile Corridor/AC Hotel.

Jazz continues to thrive in Missoula in venues such as Stave & Hoop, the ZACC, the Old Post, The KettleHouse Amphitheater, Draughtworks, The Wilma and Ten Spoon Vineyard & Winery (just to name just a few) in addition to the many performances around town through school and educational programs. Missoula is also home to annual showcases and festivals such as "Jazzoula" presented by Bruce Micklus (Rockin Rudy's) and the UM Buddy DeFranco Jazz Festival presented by the University of Montana and created by Lance Boyd.

As performing musicians grow and mature, there is a natural process that occurs mentoring and guiding young musicians. On any given evening, having an opportunity to hear the more experienced musicians usually comes with a surprise with the appearance of a younger high school musician or university player sitting in on a tune or two.

Jazz builds a skill set for younger musicians which mirrors the skills we all need for success; fundamentals & scales (developing building blocks), improvisation (the willingness to fail and pick yourself up), learning tunes (developing vocabulary), communication (working together), styles (openness to new and different ways of playing), professionalism (being on time & prepared) in addition to humility (always someone who can do it better) and experience (you have to do it to understand it)!

The journey of a musician never ends, and we are glad to have opportunities in Missoula to present swinging music along with a forum for mentoring. As the great trumpet player (and alum of the Duke Ellington and Count Basie orchestras) Clark Terry would say, "Keep on Keepin' on"!

MISSOULA ART MUSEUM. DOWNTOWN'S CULTURAL ANCHOR OF NEARLY 50 YEARS.

When asked what makes missoula home for you, I imagine that somewhere near the top of the list, the word "community" appears. Broadly speaking, our Missoula community is defined by geography, and everyone living in this place abundant with natural beauty is subconsciously bound together. It would not surprise me if every person who answers this question would point to the landscape—the downtown stretch of the Clark Fork River, the high peaks of the Rattlesnake Wilderness always visible from town, the flat valley spreading to the West. But Missoulians understand well that community is more than a physical space, it is the shared values and understanding of what enriches our lives on a daily basis. Without a doubt, Missoula has long known that the strength of the arts is vital to a healthy community.



In 1972, more than 10,000 people attended the Missoula Festival of the Arts and one year later petitioned the Missoula City Council to establish a museum in what was then Missoula's defunct public library building. The Missoula Art Museum opened in 1975 in the Carnegie Library that AJ Gibson built. The museum came to be 50 years ago through a groundswell of support from local artists, Missoula County, and the City of Missoula, and has grown with the community over the years. With recognition that the museum sits on the ancestral land of the Salish and Kalispell people, MAM

dedicated the Lynda M. Frost Gallery in 2006 to be a space to always exhibit the work of contemporary Native artists and to mirror a similar commitment already held in the MAM Collection. While MAM continues to operate with that original support, it does not exist today simply as a result of that groundswell half a century ago, rather the lifeblood of the museum is found in the extraordinary caliber of artists that live in our midst and the open-minded Missoula community that cherishes engagement with new ideas and creative expression. The strength of this civic pride is the reason that even during times of rapid growth, Missoula still feels authentic and like a community.






