## Saint Louis-Lyon Sister Cities Scholarship Application procedures

The **Saint Louis-Lyon Sister Cities Committee** is pleased to offer each year one or more Nason-Goodman scholarships to undergraduate or graduate students of French planning to study in Lyon for an academic year or a semester or the equivalent. Availability and the amount of the scholarship are dependent on the yield of the Committee's fund-raising program.

# Deadline for Academic year 2019-2020: 29 April 2019

## I. Eligibility requirements:

Applicants should have:

- at least sophomore standing at one of the Saint Louis area universities
- the intention of pursuing studies given in the French language in Lyon *and* upon return to the U.S.

## II. How to apply:

**1.** Speak with the Saint Louis-Lyon Sister Cities Committee **university coordinator** (*names indicated below*) *prior* to submitting the application.

**2.** Complete the application form (see attached).

## **3.** "Why I want to study in Lyon" $(1 - 1 \frac{1}{2} p)$ .

Explain your background in French and how study in Lyon will enhance your cultural understanding and benefit your academic and career goals. Indicate how you might help promote to other students the advantages of study in Lyon upon your return to Saint Louis.

4. Include with your application:

- an official transcript and a list of courses you are currently taking.
- two letters of recommendation (see application form for details).
- confirmation that you have been accepted in a university-approved program to study in Lyon.

5. Interview.

After submission of the complete application, the candidate will be contacted to arrange a time for an interview.

Note: Some factors taken under consideration by the Committee are:

- GPA,
- whether the candidate is a French major,
- whether the student will be spending the full academic year in Lyon,
- a willingness to promote Saint Louis-Lyon cultural ties.

### III. Obligations of the awardees:

#### • Reports:

Whether they benefit from a one-semester scholarship or a two-semester academic year scholarship, students submit a report describing their activities during the previous semester in Lyon. Students studying in Lyon during the Fall semester need to submit their report to the Chair of the Scholarship Committee by **January 18, 2020.** Students participating in a university approved one-semester in Lyon program during the Spring, 2020 semester should plan to send in their report by **May 1, 2020**.

Students benefiting from a Saint Louis-Lyon scholarship that supports study in Lyon over the entire academic year (two semesters) receive the first installment of their scholarship in August prior to their departure to Lyon. The second disbursement, corresponding to the Spring semester, is made after the mid-year report has been received.

#### • Presentation:

To help encourage on-going efforts in support of the scholarship fund, returning scholarship holders are encouraged to continue the past awardees' tradition of participating in the annual fund-raising dinner held in November. At the dinner, returning scholarship winners are asked to speak briefly (5-6 minutes) on their experience in Lyon.

### • Outreach:

So as to enhance the Committee's mission to foster cultural exchanges among the citizens of St. Louis and Lyon, returning awardees should be available to give classroom presentations at their home university on their Lyon experience and to help publicize the Saint Louis-Lyon Sister Cities scholarship.

Returning Scholarship Awardees are also encouraged to attend the annual meeting, known as the *Goûter*, generally held in February or early March. At this meeting, returning awardees meet and share their Lyon experiences informally with members.

#### Membership:

Sister Cities awardees are granted a two-year membership in the organization that covers a) the year they are in Lyon, and b) the year following their return to St. Louis. Former scholarship winners are encouraged to continue to support the St. Louis – Lyon efforts to enhance cultural ties between the twin cities through their annual membership in the Saint Louis-Lyon Sister Cities organization and funding-raising events.
