FDL County Health Department Offers Free Radon Test Kits

The Fond du Lac County Health Department would like to remind community members that regular testing for radon, every two years, in your home, office and school is an important way to protect your health. To encourage testing,

the Fond du Lac County Health Department is offering a free short-term radon test kit in exchange for a non-perishable, non-expired food item to be donated to a local food pantry in November and December. The test kits are easy to use and testing instructions are included in the kit.

Radon is an odorless, colorless, tasteless gas that occurs naturally in Wisconsin soil and can enter homes primarily through cracks and openings in basement or foundation floors and walls. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer, behind smoking. The only way to know if you have safe levels of radon inside your home is by testing. While supplies last,

non-perishable, non-expired food items can be exchanged for a free short term radon test kit through December 31st at the Fond du Lac County Health Department, 160 S. Macy St. in Fond du Lac, Monday-Friday from 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Only one shortterm radon test kit per household.

Short Term Radon kits are available all year-round for \$10.

Steve Rose, who grew up on a dairy farm near Eden, is the son of Jean and the late David Rose. He is known for writing Leap of Faith: God Must Be a Packer Fan. Steve's wife Charlene, who was born in Fond du Lac, contributed a heartwarming chapter called "7 Seeds of Service."

Charlene says, "My grandma taught me many valuable life lessons through her wisdom that I am reminded of and carry with me today to help others." She goes on to say, "With the challenges that people are going through we certainly feel the timing is right for our message of hope and encouragement that the The Peanut Butter Promise provides."

The premise of the Peanut Butter Promise is that we're each born with every talent, ability and gift and the necessary desire to fulfill our God-given pur-



pose. Just as peanut butter would meet jelly and make a great sandwich, there are people called Peanut Butter Promise Partners who come into our lives to help us achieve the dreams and desires of our heart at the right time - that we can succeed regardless of where we are in life, despite the mistakes we've made. The book is laid out in sets of Seven Powers, Princi-

ples, Laws and Virtues of the Peanut Butter Promise that are surrounded by many

great examples and stories. Culver's co-founder, Craig Culver, has written an enthusiastic Foreword for the book which says, "My story and that of my family, seems to agree with many aspects of The Peanut Butter Promise."

There is a humorous and touching story in the book about Jada, who is currently a senior at Kewaskum High School, who along with a few other class mates showed up to help the Roses clean up after the August 2018 tornado. Upon seeing the teens come to the Rose's door wearing Kewaskum FFA t-shirts and gloves, clearly ready to duty, Steve went out to meet them and commented sheepishly, "Oh man, you're here to help aren't you?" The kids nodded before



Steve moaned, "We were taught to not like you guys from Kewaskum." Of course he was joking. The students helped for two days in the clean up.

Steve and Charlene are represented by globalleading literary agency Dupree Miller in Dallas, who has high hopes for The Peanut Butter Promise.
