My dear friends in Christ,

Sometimes when we read the gospels we can experience a kind of envy. For example, we might think, "Wouldn't it have been amazing to see Jesus the way His disciples saw Him, to hear Him as He spoke to crowds, and to experience His healing touch as He healed the sick?" For whatever reason, we sometimes speak of the Lord Jesus as if He lived a long time ago, but is now far from us. We speak of Him as if He abandoned us after He ascended to the Father.

We're so forgetful... how often do we forget that on the night before He died, Jesus left us with the gift of His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity: the Most Holy Eucharist. We forget that Jesus is as present to us today in the Holy Eucharist as He was when He walked on the earth over 2000 years ago... Jesus is alive and present in the Holy Eucharist! When we adore the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist, we get to really and truly see our God face to face, hear His voice, and encounter His healing touch!

Whether you've been coming to adoration for years, or whether you've never experienced it before, I want to encourage you, from the bottom of my heart, to come to adoration. Jesus waits for you there... He is inviting you to come and rest in Him. "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Mt. 11:28).

Prayerfully consider spending an hour a week before the Lord. It might sound intimidating at first, but it's an hour that will change your life. Time spent before God is literally the best use of your time, and you won't regret it. In the words of Ven. Fulton Sheen: "Looking at the Eucharistic Lord for an hour transforms the heart in a mysterious way." Prayer is the key to transforming your heart and the heart of your parish.
