Background of Event: Home station IDT with focus on Construction Operations and Survivability.

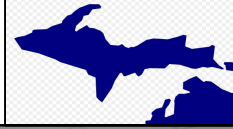
Key Points of Training:

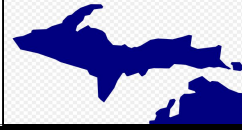
