Key Points of Training: Soldiers performed CBRN tasks.


Upper Left : SPC Larson runs the Check-in/Check-out station for the MRE

Key Points of Training:


Training focused on Final packing and preparation for movement to Latvia, Crew serve Weapon PMI, Medical training, and an MRE Event in Ishpeming.
