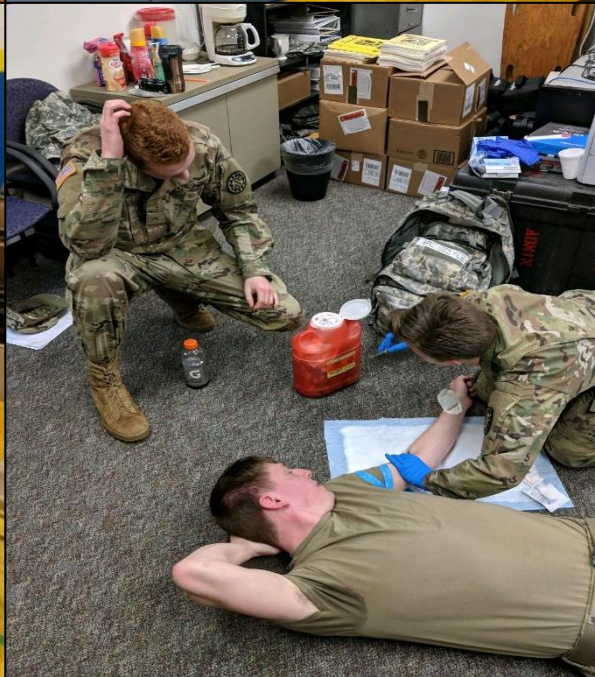
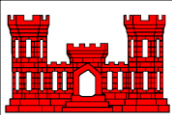


Title: IDT – April 2019

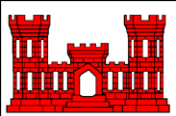


Title: FSC 107 EN BN April IDT

Background of Event: FSC conducted a MUTA 5 drill at the Marquette Armory with a focus on inventories and maintenance activities.

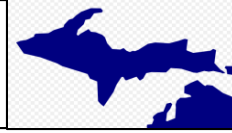
Key Points of Training:

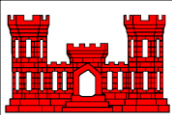
Title: IDT – April 2019

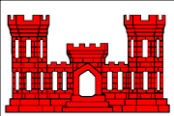
Key Points of Training:

Key Points of Training:

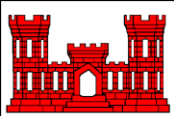
