40 YEARS - OCTOBER 15, 1980

Last Fall, HQ received a rush order from the State A.G. office for someone from the WWII 107 to represent the outfit at an Executive Declaration Signing Ceremony in commemoration of the 40th anniversary of the October 15, 1940, callup of Michigan National Guard units (mostly assigned to the 32d Infantry Division). The ceremonial Executive Declaration was scheduled to be held at Gov. Milliken's Lansing office. After some frantic cranking on the ol' field we located Raymond J. "Ray" Campeau in phone, his Lansing foxhole who consented to represent the 107th at the prestigious ceremony. way back in 1940, was a Plat Sgt in Co D (Marquette) out of L'Anse. Formal invitations from the Dept. of Military Affairs were subsequently mailed to the selected representatives of the various outfits being recognized including; Gen Schnipke, Col. Horton, Col. Angell, Col. McCall, Col. Bob Stone, Col. Weber, W.O. Schmidt, M/Sgt Lee Yen and our own S/Sgt Campeau. Ray later reported: "It was a very brief but impressive It was a great honor for me to be ceremony. there representing the 107th, but as you can see




England regarding U.S.
