(Both battalions hit the beach before the infantry - the 146 to blow underwater obstacles to clear lanes for landing craft and the 112 to sweep the beach for mines and mark safe routes inland for the assault troops.

The Company C platoon photos were taken 14 Dec 1944 - just 2 days before the Belgium/Luxemborg/Germany front erupted in what is known as the Battle of the Bulge. Company C was hit hard in hastily prepared defensive position near Bulligen Belgium early in the morning of 16 Dec and many portrayed in the Company C platoon photos were casualties or captured by the SS panzer armored assault forces. The fate of many as POW's is unknown and consequently the Association has a much higher percentage of "Unlocated" in the Co C ranks than the other 254 companies. Again, hopefully, lots of information will be forthcoming so our Association records can be updated.
