107th Engineer Association Business Meeting Minutes 21 July 2007 Sault Ste. Marie, MI

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 1308 hrs by President George Kotkowicz. 27 members were in attendance.
- 2. The minutes from the 2006 business meeting were read by Secretary Tom Perry. A motion was made by Dan Garceau and seconded by Joe Testolin to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.
- 3. The 2007 Treasurers Report was presented by Treasurer Don Bussiere. A motion was made by Dennis Cummings and seconded by Don Small to approve the report. Motion Carried.
- 4. Old Business:
 - a. The Association is still maintaining a web site. Ross Stevens, the webmaster, has informed the secretary that the web hosting fees are \$10 per month. A motion was made by Ed Jachimski and seconded by Jim Dougovito to pay the website costs. Motion carried.
 - b. After some research and investigating it was determined that at this time it is too difficult to try and sell Association Memorabilia on the website. The logistics turned out to be too difficult because off all the different personnel involved and their vast separation geographically.
 - c. The flags on the Battalion monument as Camp Grayling were repainted and look good. There are now two other organizational monuments located at the memorial park and one MI Army National Guard KIA monument.
 - d. As a follow up to last year's business meeting there was again a lot of discussion about the remaining money in the "memorialization fund." Treasurer Bussiere informed us that there is \$3047 still earmarked for said purpose. After a lengthy discussion it was agreed that the money should stay earmarked for memorialization and for up keep on the existing monuments and plaques. A motion was made by Mike Floriano and seconded by Gary Marcotte to place the funds in a CD until such time that we need to use some of it for memorial activities. Motion carried.
 - e. At the 2006 business meeting in Ishpeming, Dennis Cummings and his wife volunteered to pay any extra costs for mailing a 2007 Bull Sheet to every Soldier in the battalion. The additional costs came out to be approximately \$150. We had a very poor response from the additional mailings. We received about 4 responses from Soldiers who were not already on the Association mailing list. So it was determined we probably wouldn't try that idea again for a few years. In living up to his part of the bargain, Dennis made a generous donation to the Association as well as a speech on the state of patriotism in our country. He gave \$120 toward the mailing costs. He donated \$50 in honor of Mr. Wayne Ray, who is one of our 85+ year old members and a WW II vet. Mr. Ray, who is in his late 80's, paid for a LIFE Membership in the Association. I guess he figures he is going to live long enough to make it a wise monetary decision. Dennis also donated \$80 in honor of his 4 nephews serving in Iraq and Afghanistan and \$50 in memory of the late CSM Dick Oja.

5. New Business:

- a. A motion was made by Tim Houle and seconded by Ed Jachimski to nominate Det 1, 1431st (former Co A) Engineer Company in Baraga to host the 2008 reunion. Motion carried. (Secretary's Note: Because of the pending mobilization of the 1431st Engr Co, the decision was made, mid-year, to move the 2008 reunion to the Marquette Armory. Det 1, 1430th Engr Co will be our hosts.)
- b. A motion was made by Jim Dougovito and seconded by Ed Jachimski to have the reunion dates be 15-17 August 2008. Motion carried.
- c. The following slate of officers was presented for approval. Motion made by Ed Jachimski and seconded by Dan Garceau to approve the slate as presented. Motion carried.

Location Change for 2008 Reunion

If my memory serves me correctly, the last time the reunion was held in Marquette was 1988. I was a 2LT and the Detachment Commander of Det 1, HHC 107 Engr Bn in Marquette. The award for the youngest member of the Association attending the reunion that year was given to (then) SSG Ken Kampe. WOW that was a long time ago!!!! The reason we haven't been back the Marquette Armory for so many years is that the unit assigned there was not a part of the battalion. The 1075th Maintenance Company was assigned to Marquette for almost 20 years. The 1075th was formed around a core of many 107th NCOs and officers. But over the years they built their own legacy and NCO/officer corps. The 1075th was deactivated in 2006. As a result of the reorganization of the MI Army National Guard, Det 1, 1430th Engineer Company (formerly Co C, 107th) was assigned to the Marquette Armory. When the 1075th deactivated, many of the Soldiers transferred to the Field Support Company in Ishpeming and deployed to Iraq with the unit. The Marquette Armory was the location of the very first reunion held August 20, 1961.

Battalion Mobilizations and Happenings since the Last Bull Sheet

Most of you know that the former HHC, now HSC & FSC, were mobilized last summer. They left for mobilization station on 22 July 2007, the last day of the 2007 Association reunion. They will be home sometime late this summer.

The 1431st Engineer Company (formerly Co A) was notified late in 2007 that they would be mobilized for duty in Iraq some time in late 2008. They have been going through a lot of individual and unit training in preparation for their mission.

The 1432nd Engineer Company (formerly Co B) performed their Annual Training in December 2007 in Douglas, Arizona. They supported the border security mission, Operation Jump Start, by installing fence and repairing roads.

The 1430th Engineer Company (formerly Co C) performed their AT in Honduras in March- doing concrete construction work. They poured concrete foundations and footings for future water storage tanks and school construction.

The 1437th Engineer Company went to annual training at Camp Ripley, MN in June 2007. This year they are performing a home station annual training because they are receiving a new bridge. It is called the Dry Span Bridge, which is relatively new to the Army inventory.

Reorganization of the 107th Engineer Battalion

Over the last few years the Army has been going through a "transformation" and fighting the Global War On Terrorism (GWOT). The MI Army National Guard and the 107^{th} Engineer Battalion have been affected by this initiative. In the Engineer branch there are no longer any "organic battalions." An organic battalion was an organization where there was an HHC and lettered line companies. In time of war the whole battalion was to mobilize as a whole, like the WW II days. Those of you who have followed the battalion's activities in the last few years know that there have been half dozen partial mobilizations of the battalion's personnel to support the GWOT. Now the battalion is no longer an organic battalion. Each company is a separate mobilization entity with a number designation and can/will be called to active duty individually by company. This reorganization of the battalion and deactivation of other UP units is detailed in the table below. HSC, 107^{th} Engineer Battalion will be the peacetime command and control headquarters for all the UP units.
