Business Meeting Minutes, 16 August 2008
Marquette, MI

1. The meeting was called to order at 1330 hrs by President Jason Rolling. 36 members were in attendance.
2. The minutes from the 2007 business meeting were read by Secretary Tom Perry. A motion was made by Jim Dougovito and seconded by Ed Jachimski to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.
3. The 2008 Treasurers Report was presented by Treasurer Don Bussiere. A motion was made by Jim Baker and seconded by Dan Garceau to approve the report. Motion Carried.
4. Old Business:
 - a. The Association is still maintaining a web site. Ross Stevens, the webmaster, has informed the secretary that the web hosting fees are \$10 per month. A motion was made by Ed Jachimski and seconded by Jim Dougovito to pay the website costs. Motion carried.
 - b. SSG(ret) Bob Wilson, who retired from Co C, 107NG and is currently residing in Thailand, sent a check to pay for one year's worth of the web hosting fees. The Association gave him a big round of applause and sends its thanks for the generous donation.
5. New Business:
 - a. A motion was made by Bob Beuprey and seconded by Joe Testolin to nominate 1432nd (former Det 1, Co B) Engineer Company in Iron River to host the 2008 reunion on the dates of 21-23 August 2009. Motion carried.
 - b. The following slate of officers was presented for approval. Motion made by Joel Jarvi and seconded by Pete Injasoulian to approve the slate as presented. Motion carried.

6. I contacted the full time NCOIC at each armory to solicit a copy of their retiree mailing lists. I added the retirees' names to our mailing list (if they weren't already included) so they would get a copy of the Bull Sheet. This was done in hopes of gaining some new members. I received responses from about 10 new or formerly inactive Association members, who paid their dues. The effort was a success.
 - a. The highway formerly designated as M 107 (a Michigan state highway) is no longer a state highway, and has been turned over to the Ontonagon County Road Commission (OCRC). With the move came the requirement to rename the road. The Association's very own treasurer Don Bussiere is a member of the OCRC Board of Directors. He was instrumental in getting the road renamed to the 107th Engineer Battalion Memorial Highway. So thank Bish the next time you see him.
 - b. Ed Jachimski volunteered to contact Fred Stonehouse, the author of the battalion history book, to see if he is interested in doing an update to the booklet. The current history book ends with the year 1981. We would like to see the history brought up to date.
 - c. Joe Floriano volunteered to chair a committee of members to look into how we should honor and memorialize all the battalion units and personnel who have deployed in support of the Global War on Terror (GWOT). We have placed plaques at all the battalion armories to memorize the battalion's deployments and combat tours from 1881 through WW II and the 1990's. Now we need to figure out how to continue with recording the battalion's contributions to GWOT. Others who volunteered to serve on the committee are: Jason Rolling, James Baker, Jeff Gibson, Gary LaFreniere and Perry Nora.
 - d. There were only six WW II veterans present at this reunion. They were: Ed Vickstrom, A.J. "Tiny" Metro & son, Bob McGuire & wife, Keith Freeze & son, Howard Nichola and Dick Wills & wife. All the gentlemen who were present were long time members and have attended many reunions. In the words of Ed Vickstrom, "I wonder who will be the Moose LaCombe of the WW II generation." (You will recall that Moose was the first President of the Association and the last active Association WW I vet to pass away.)
 - e. As usual there was much discussion on how to keep the Association going and getting more (and younger) members to be active. As was demonstrated in the paragraph above, the Association is, and has been for quite a few years, predominantly National Guard veterans. Here are some of the suggestions for enhancing the membership:
 - i. Put a survey in the Bull Sheet asking members to provide feedback on the best time of year and/or dates for the reunion.

- ii. Include an article in the Bull Sheet informing Soldiers and alumni that the reunion is an informal gathering. There is no requirement to wear the Class A or Dress Blue uniform. It is optional attire for the Saturday evening banquet.
 - iii. Include information in the Bull Sheet forecasting the locations and dates for the next 3-4 reunions. The forecast should be as accurate as possible, with the understanding that things change which may cause the dates and or location to change. The most difficult task is staying away from dates that conflict with the MIARNG annual training. Even though we may not get many of the active Guardsmen to the reunion, the host unit needs time to prepare and work the reunion weekend.
 - iv. It was also mentioned that the Association by-laws may need to be amended to reflect the changing dates for the reunion. The Secretary will research the matter and report back at the 2009 business meeting.
 - v. A motion was made by Dan Garceau and seconded by Don Small to put an article in the Bull Sheet informing potential new or "returning inactive" members to come back and received a free one year complimentary membership. Motion carried.
 - vi. There was some discussion on including the non-107th units that deployed with HSC/FSC on our mailing list. The secretary will insure they are included on Association mailings and website, if they so choose.
- f. For the umpteenth time, Mrs. Joyce Ward donated \$107 to the Association. The Association thanks her for the generous support.
7. The meeting concluded with MAJ(ret) Ed Jachimski leading the members in reciting the Association Pledge.
8. A motion was made by Don Small and seconded by Eric Dahlgren to adjourn at 1425 hrs. Motion carried.

107th ENGINEER BATTALION IN MONEYMORE, N. IRELAND: DO YOU REMEMBER?

Does the Irish place-name MONEYMORE mean anything to you? If it does, then you are a veteran of the 107th Engineer Battalion and I need your help!

As part of my research into the battalion's 1942 stay in Northern Ireland, I would like to call on all 107th veterans for recollections, photographs, letters, v-mails etc of your stay in our beautiful town.

Today in Moneymore, five pairs of Nissen Hut warehouses still remain as a testimony to the 107th's first ETO construction project. However, they are nearing the end of their lives, and I expect in 10 years they will have all but gone. Nevertheless, people from all over Ireland, Europe and the United States who visit Moneymore still question the origin of these buildings, and it has been suggested by our local council that some historical record be kept regarding this episode in the town's WWII history. Almost certainly, a monument and display will be erected nearby to commemorate the 107th Engineer Battalion's impact on Moneymore.

Everyone over here, both young and old, knows American soldiers were here during WWII, but they do not know what part of the Army you belonged to, where you had come from, what were your names and what became of you after you left. The 107th was no ordinary outfit and I want to make the people of Moneymore and Northern Ireland proud to have shared a little part in your history and be aware of what you had to endure after leaving our shores!

Our parents and grandparents have told my generation that The Yanks were here; but when we ask them to tell us more they say I never asked. I will attempt to rectify this and find out as much as I can. Hopefully a written record will follow leaving forever a source of reference to the future generations of Northern Ireland when they ask the question, 'Who were the American soldiers in Moneymore during the war?' Get in touch and help me tell your story.

Here are the proposed dates, subject to approval of the membership, for the next 3 years; 2010, Baraga (It was supposed to be in Baraga in 2008, but they were too busy training up for their deployment.), 2011, Kingsford (The last time the reunion was in Kingsford was 1991, because the units assigned to the armory have not been a part of the battalion. Now they are back in the fold.), 2012, Gladstone. It is difficult to set locations too far in advance because we never know when one of our units will be mobilized or perform AT out of the state or country.
