The Hermitage Hotel



The Madrona

Healdsburg, California



History:

In 1879, John Alexander Paxton bought 260 acres of land in the Dry Creek Valley area for \$10,500. He named this property "Madrona Knoll Rancho," as "Madrona" is the local term for an Arbutus species. In 1880–1881, he built a 17-room, three-story gabled mansion, to which he commuted on weekends from his work in the city.

In 1981, the property (then reduced to eight acres) was transformed from a family residence into a country inn by the new owner, John Harry Muir. The manor was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1987.

This rich history and status as a Sonoma County Historic Landmark add a unique charm to The Madrona that your guests will appreciate.



Today:

With unique accommodations in the Mansion, Carriage House, and bungalows, The Madrona is just 15 minutes from Santa Rosa Airport and one hour from SFO and OAK.

Your guests will feel worlds away, while still enjoying the comfort and convenience of a memorable event. Our private boardroom, diverse dining spaces, and close proximity to offsite team-building activities create a cohesive and unique setting for a corporate retreat.


The Madrona can accommodate a wide range of events, from small, private meetings for eight to larger-scale events for up to 60, ensuring that we can meet your specific needs.
