Income: There were some membership renewals and from Newsletter advertising.



REBELS LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

For the past several months, the **REBELS** Auto Club has been working behind the scenes with the Nebraska Legislature to remedy a problem a lot of us have faced in building or restoring our cars - namely the titling of Junk Vehicles.

In the past, if you had a 'Junk Title,' you could never license or sell a that vehicle. Since many (if not most) classic cars are built from parts found at a junkyard or picked off junk vehicles, the Club felt this obsolete regulation should be corrected.

The Legislator just passed **LB-831** to correct this. The vote was 41-0!

This is great news for hotrodders and car lovers in our state. This

means many will be able to get a title for their classic vehicle where they couldn't before.

Many of you may not have been aware of the Club's efforts to get this bill passed. Many thanks to **Jim McNeil** who organized the effort.



Are you getting old when you wake up with that morning after feeling and you didn't do anything the night before?







