

Court-Appointed Bureaucrats Billed \$2.38 Million in Just 66 Days!

Before the government stepped in, Par Funding was a booming enterprise. They were bringing in a staggering \$179 million in top-line revenue, all while keeping overhead incredibly lean. For the entire year, Par Funding spent a mere \$2.3 million in expenses to generate that massive revenue. That is how real, private-sector business works.

But then the government decided they knew better. They stepped in, shut down the company's operations, and handed the keys over to a court-appointed Receiver. What has this Receiver done since taking over? They ceased operations. They are generating absolutely zero new revenue. And took on zero new clients. And their reward for running a once-thriving business into the ground? A staggering bill of \$2,380,111.00 for a single, three-month quarter. We have previously exposed the outrageous plundering in the Receiver's 4th billing cycle, but this abuse has been going on since the beginning. This \$2.38 million money-grab is from their 3rd billing application. Let that sink in. The bureaucrats burned through more cash in 66 business days of doing nothing productive than the actual business spent in an entire year generating \$179 million!

Since When Does a "Neutral" Receiver Act Like a Shadow Prosecutor?

By law, a Receiver is supposed to be a "neutral officer of the Court." As the defendants forcefully argue in their legal objections, a Receiver has a strict "fiduciary duty" to "protect and preserve" the receivership's assets for the people who are entitled to it.

So why on earth is the Receiver paying millions of dollars to actively investigate Par Funding defendants? And why does a neutral Receiver have "witnesses"?

The SEC and the FBI have their own massive, taxpayer-funded budgets. If the government wants to conduct an investigation, they have the resources to do it. Instead, the Receiver has hired

private investigators out of Miami (HD Investigative Group) and is flying them—and various witnesses—up to Pennsylvania, New York, and New Jersey.

Just look at the Receiver's own billing records, highlighted on Page 3 of the Defendants' Objection: **(See DE 601)**

January 10, 2021: Three HDIG investigators billed \$1,350.00 for 6 hours of "PA Inv. Trip Prep/Inv. Research."

January 19, 2021: Instead of using virtual methods, three HDIG investigators flew to Pennsylvania for "Prep/Doc Review," billing 15 hours at a cost of \$3,375.00. That very same day, two investigators billed another \$1,375.00 for 6 hours just to interview witness "JK" (James Klenk, a former Par Funding employee).

January 20, 2021: Two investigators billed 13 hours (\$2,925.00) traveling through New York City, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania to conduct more interviews.

January 21, 2021: Three investigators traveled to various properties for "Inventory Search/Pics/Locksmith," billing a massive 30 hours in a single day for \$6,750.00.

They are doing the government's job on Par Funding's dime. They are draining the estate's money—money that belongs to the actual stakeholders—to act as an arm of the prosecution. This is not "preserving assets." It is a wealth transfer from a private business to the legal establishment.

JUDGE RODOLFO RUIZ: The Rubber-Stamp for the Swamp

But who is letting this happen? The buck stops with Judge Rodolfo Ruiz. By law, courts are required to carefully scrutinize fee applications to ensure the time spent, services performed, and expenses incurred are justified and reasonable.

Instead, Judge Ruiz has functioned as a blind rubber stamp for this unprecedented pillaging. Blinded by confirmation bias and an obvious animus toward the defendants—fueled by the initial lies he was told by the government to justify bringing this case in the first place, Judge Ruiz has completely abandoned his duty to question these exorbitant fees. In fact, this blatant bias and absolute refusal to scrutinize the Receiver's financial draining of the estate was a primary reason the defendants were forced to file a motion to recuse him from the case. **(See DE 630)**

He simply robo-signs the bills without a shred of scrutiny. There have now been 22 of these outrageous bills, funneling a staggering \$50 million to the Receiver and his cronies. Regardless of the defense's constant objections and desperate pleadings to stop the bleeding of the estate, Judge Ruiz continues to green-light the slaughter of this company to this very day.

THE COMPREHENSIVE WALL OF SHAME: Every Biller Milking the Estate

To see exactly how these elites are bilking the estate, look at the billing records. More than 30 different lawyers, paralegals, and consultants are frantically billing the estate, violating basic ethical rules (like ABA Rule 1.5 and Formal Opinion 93-379) by overstaffing internal meetings, charging attorney rates for secretarial work, and copy-pasting "cloned" time entries.
